## No. 1 Huskers Head to Colorado

Top-ranked Nebraska looks to extend its win streak to 24 matches, as the Huskers venture to Boulder, Colo., this weekend to take on the Colorado Buffaloes. First serve from the Coors Event Center is set for 7:30 p.m. (Central) and fans can listen to all of the action on B107.3 FM in Lincoln and on Huskers.com. In addition, HuskersNside subscribers can watch Saturday's match against CU.

The Huskers (13-0, 6-0 Big 12) continued to roll along, sweeping No. 17 Kansas State Wednesday night at the NU Coliseum. Sarah Pavan had 16 kills and a season-high five blocks, while Kori Cooper added 11 kills on .688 hitting and a season-best seven stiffs in helping the Huskers hit .387 against a solid Wildcat defense. The Huskers lead the country with a .350 hitting percentage and have been even better in conference play, hitting at a .379 clip through their first six league matches. A team has hit .350 or better in a season just seven times in NCAA history, a feat which has been done by only five programs (Hofstra, Penn State, St. Mary's, Florida A&M and Long Beach State), while the conference single-season record is .331 by the Huskers back in 1986.

Colorado (5-9, 0-6 Big 12) has been snakebit in Big 12 play, dropping five of its six matches in five games, including matches against nationally ranked Kansas State and Oklahoma. In all, seven of CU's nine losses have been five-game setbacks. The Buffaloes also have one of the most impressive non-conference wins by a Big 12 team this season, a sweep of No. 11 Cal in Boulder in September. Last season, the Huskers swept CU in Lincoln before the Buffaloes came back with a five-game win in Boulder, snapping a 17-match losing streak to the Huskers.

### NU Volleyball Quick Hits

- Nebraska's .500 hitting percentage against Baylor was its best since hitting .523 against Kansas on Oct. 10, 2001 - the only other time NU hit .500 or better in the rally-scoring era.
- Nebraska went through the entire month of September (nine matches) without dropping a game. It marked only the third time it has happened in school history and first since 1995.
- The Huskers have held their last five foes to a combined .092 hitting, and now lead the Big 12 in opponent hitting (.139).
- The Huskers have swept their last 15 straight Big 12 foes at home dating back to 2005.
- NU is going for its 12th straight sweep on Saturday, which would be its longest streak of sweeps since 2001.

**Scouting Colorado**

Under Coach Pi'i Aiu (185-124 in 11 years at CU), Colorado has reached NCAA postseason action in nine of the last 10 years. The Buffaloes, who reached the second round of last season's NCAA Tournament, were dealt a blow in the preseason after season-ending surgery to Amber Sutherland, who earned honorable-mention All-Big 12 honors last season. Colorado has given fans their money's worth in 2007, already playing seven five-game matches in their first 14 contests, including five in six Big 12 matches. CU's biggest win came outside of league play, as the Buffs swept No. 11 Cal in Boulder in early September.

Outside hitter Mallori Gibson leads the Buffaloes with 3.73 kills per game, while right-side hitter Alex Buth chips in 3.25 kills per game, as the duo combines for nearly half of Colorado's kills. Freshman Schylur Edelman paces Colorado in blocks with 1.02 per game.

Nebraska leads the all-time series, 42-6 and had won 17 straight matches against CU before losing in five games in Boulder last November.

**Last Matchup vs. Colorado**

Despite a career night from Tracy Stalls, the No. 1 Nebraska volleyball team suffered its first loss of the season, falling in five games to Colorado in front of a Coors Event Center record crowd of 4,111.

Colorado not only snapped the Huskers' 23-match win streak, but downed a No. 1 team for the first time in program history. CU's win also snapped an 17-match losing streak to Nebraska that dated back to 1997.

Stalls was one of the lone bright spots for the Huskers in a losing effort, recording a career-high 16 kills while matching her personal best with 12 blocks, while hitting .357. Behind the efforts of Stalls, Nebraska dominated the overall stats, out-hitting Colorado, .229-.162, while totaling a season-high 23.5 blocks, but the Huskers were out-hit in each of the final two games, including a .308-.214 total in the finale.

Stalls was one of four Huskers to finish in double figures, as Sarah Pavan totaled 17 kills and 10 digs, while Jordan Larson and Dani Mancuso chipped in 13 and 11 kills, respectively. In all four Huskers - Stalls, Pavan, Larson and Rachel Holloway (57 assists and 13 digs) - totaled double-doubles in the loss.

**Worth Noting**

- Nebraska's roster features three players with Colorado ties in senior Tracy Stalls (Denver), sophomore Rachel Holloway (Smoky Hill HS) and freshman Lindsey Licht (Arvada and Grandview HS). Holloway and Licht

were the state players of the year in 2004 and 2005, respectively.

- Nebraska brings a national-best 23-match win streak into Saturday's contest at Kansas. In that span, NU has dropped just six games and has been pushed to five games only once - the 2006 NCAA regional final against Minnesota.

- Nebraska is 69-3 (.958) on the road in Big 12 action in eight seasons under Coach John Cook.

- The Huskers are 70-2 (.972) in their last 72 Big 12 Conference matches dating back to the 2003 season.

- The Huskers have played their last 86 matches as the nation's top-ranked team in the AVCA poll, dating back to the end of the 2004 campaign. NU is 82-4 in that stretch.

- With the No. 1 ranking in Monday's CSTV/AVCA poll, the Huskers have now spent 78 weeks all-time at No. 1, the most of any Division I program. UCLA is second with 51 weeks. NU has been ranked No. 1 in 38 of the last 39 polls dating back to the start of 2005.

- Nebraska leads the nation in hitting percentage (.350), assists (16.77) and kills (18.08) per game. The Huskers are on pace to shatter single-season marks in all three areas and will look to become the second team in NCAA history to lead all three categories in a year.

- Balance has been at the heart of Nebraska's offensive attack as four different players - Sarah Pavan, Jordan Larson, Christina Houghtelling and Kori Cooper - have led NU in kills in matches this season, while Tracy Stalls is fourth nationally with a .480 hitting percentage. All five of NU's primary attackers average at least 2.47 kills per game.

- Nebraska has a 109-5 (.956) record since the start of the 2004 season.

- Nebraska has won its last 18 matches against ranked opponents over the last two years following Wednesday's sweep of Kansas State.

- NU will look to break its school record for most consecutive home victories next Wednesday against Iowa State. NU has won its last 63 home matches since 2004 - the third-longest streak in NCAA history.

### Husker Probable Starters

**MB - #11 Tracy Stalls: 6-4, Sr., Denver, Colo.** - Two-year captain who earned second-team AVCA All-America honors in 2006. Stalls is third in the nation in hitting percentage (.480) and averages 2.47 kills and 1.08 blocks per game this season. Stalls had eight kills and a pair of blocks against K-State Wednesday night. She had eight kills, three blocks and eight digs in the Huskers' sweep of Texas A&M on Sept. 22 and had 10 kills on .600 hitting and five stuffs vs. Texas Tech on Sept. 15. Stalls totaled seven kills on .462 hitting and three blocks in a sweep of No. 7 Texas on Sept. 12. She was named to the Ameritas Players Challenge All-Tournament team, averaging 3.00 kills per game on .654 hitting. Stalls hit over .600 in both matches, including a season-best .692 (9-0-13) against New Mexico State. She had 16 kills on .640 hitting and four blocks in a win over No. 5 UCLA to earn a spot on the AVCA Showcase All-Tournament Team. Stalls averaged 2.67 kills and 1.41 blocks per game in 2006, leading the Big 12 in hitting percentage (.400) and ranking 11th nationally. Stalls spent part of the summer with the USA National Team, playing in the Pan America Cup and averaging 2.25 kills per game while hitting .615.

**MB - #15 Kori Cooper: 6-2, So., Amarillo, Texas** - Two-year starter who has enjoyed a breakout 2007 campaign. Cooper is second in the league in hitting percentage (.465), averaging 2.74 kills and 1.18 blocks per game. She has been dominant in Big 12 matches, hitting .662 on 65 swings and averaging 3.58 kills and 1.58 blocks per game. Cooper has been in double figures in each of her last three matches, including 11 kills on .688 hitting and a season-high seven blocks against No. 17 Kansas State on Oct. 3 and a career-high 12 kills on .706 hitting and four blocks against Baylor on Sept. 29. Cooper had 11 kills and five blocks at Texas Tech on Sept. 15, and drilled nine kills on a then-career-best .692 hitting with three stuffs versus No. 7 Texas on Sept. 12. She totaled 10 kills on .350 hitting in a sweep of Penn State and hit .625 on eight swings against No. 17 Cal Poly on Sept. 3. She sparked NU to a win over UCLA in the AVCA Showcase with 10 kills on .526 hitting and four blocks. Cooper was one of two freshmen starters in 2006, averaging 1.67 kills and 0.95 blocks per game in 30 matches.

**-OR - #17 Amanda Gates: 6-1, Jr., Columbus, Neb.** - Gates alternates with Cooper at the M2 spot in the Husker lineup. She averages 1.55 kills and 0.91 blocks per game, appearing in seven matches. Gates had her best match of the year against Texas A&M on Sept. 22, recording a career-high eight kills on .429 hitting and two blocks. She totaled three kills in as many swings against No. 17 Cal Poly on Sept. 3. Gates started 11 matches in 2006, averaging 1.27 kills and 1.18 blocks per game. Gates, who has a 4.00 GPA in communication studies, totaled a career-high 10 blocks in the 2006 opener against San Diego. She made a major contribution in the NCAA title match, coming off the bench for three key blocks to spark NU's comeback from a 27-25 deficit in game three.

**L - #5 Rachel Schwartz: 5-9, Jr., Lincoln, Neb.** - Schwartz, who was NU's defensive and serving specialist in 2006, won the starting libero job in fall camp. Schwartz is eighth in the Big 12 with 3.86 digs per game, establishing a career high with 17 digs against fifth-ranked UCLA on Aug. 25 and against No. 17 Cal Poly on Sept. 3. Schwartz has been in double figures in digs in seven of the last nine matches she appeared in and had a 16-dig effort against Texas A&M on Sept. 22 and 11 digs in two games against Baylor on Sept. 29. Schwartz totaled 10 digs and matched

her career high with three service aces at Texas Tech on Sept. 15. Schwartz started 29 matches as NU's defensive specialist in 2006, averaging 2.41 digs, 0.23 aces and 0.30 assists per game. She reached double figures in digs 15 times despite playing only three rotations.

**OPP - #9 Sarah Pavan: 6-5, Sr., Kitchener, Ontario** - Pavan is a three-time, first-team AVCA All-American and reigning Honda-Broderick Cup winner. She averages 4.70 kills, 1.88 digs and 0.52 service aces per game, leading the Big 12 in aces, ranking second in points per game (5.66) and third in kills per game. Pavan totaled a match-high 16 kills on .364 hitting and five blocks in NU's sweep of No. 17 Kansas State on Oct. 3. She led NU with 13 kills and three aces against Baylor on Sept. 29. Pavan collected her second double-double of the year against Texas A&M on Sept. 22, totaling 12 kills and 10 digs. She led NU to a sweep of No. 7 Texas on Sept. 12, delivering a team-high 17 kills on .520 hitting. Pavan was selected as the MVP of both the AVCA Showcase and the Holiday Inn Downtown Classic. She was the AVCA National Player of the Week on Aug. 27, totaling 39 kills on .385 hitting in a pair of wins. She was dominant in a sweep of No. 17 Cal Poly on Sept. 3, finishing with 17 kills on .485 hitting against the Mustangs. Pavan tallied a match-high 25 kills, 12 digs and three blocks in a win over No. 5 UCLA on Aug. 25. She was the AVCA National Player of the Year in 2006, leading the Big 12 in kills (5.10) and points per game (5.98), while hitting .313 on the season. Pavan, who needs 81 kills to break Allison Weston's school record of 1,778, is on pace to become just the fourth four-time, first-team All-American in NCAA history. She also carries a 4.0 GPA in biochemistry and was recognized as the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American of the Year for all sports at the Division I level for the 2006-07 year. Pavan declined an opportunity to play with the Canadian team this summer to take an upper-level chemistry class so she can graduate in May. She made her Canadian National Team debut at age 16.

**OH - #10 Jordan Larson: 6-2, Jr., Hooper, Neb.** - Larson is a returning first-team AVCA All-American and one of the nation's premier outside hitters. She enters Saturday's match averaging 3.72 kills, 3.30 digs and 0.43 service aces per game, ranking among Big 12 leaders in both kills and aces. She has had six double-doubles on the season, including a 17-kill, 11-dig, 3-ace effort at Kansas on Sept. 26 and a 15-kill, 10-dig effort against Texas A&M on Sept. 22. She earned all-tourney honors at the AVCA Showcase and the Holiday Inn Downtown Classic. Larson recorded a season-high 16 kills and a match-high 14 digs against No. 11 Duke on Sept. 7. Larson had 11 kills, 15 digs and a season-high five blocks against No. 5 UCLA on Aug. 25. Last year, she averaged 4.13 kills and 3.50 digs per game and was the only player in the Big 12 to rank in the top 10 in both categories. She was the Big 12's Co-Defensive Player of the Year and totaled a team-high 22 double-doubles in 2006. Larson had 19 kills on .378 hitting and 15 digs in the win over No. 2 Stanford in the NCAA title match. She was also the Most Outstanding Player at the NCAA Gainesville Regional with 3.62 kills, 3.25 digs and 0.50 aces per game, highlighted by a career-high 21 kills and 17 digs in the regional final against No. 9 Minnesota.

**OH - #3 Christina Houghttelling: 6-2, Sr., Cambridge, Neb.** - Houghttelling has returned to her 2005 form after missing all of last season after shoulder surgery. She leads all Big 12 outside hitters in digs and ranks seventh overall with 3.92 per game while also averaging 3.15 kills per game. She comes off her third double-double of the

season against Baylor on Sept. 29, when she had 12 kills on .526 hitting and a match-high 16 digs. Houghtelling had 11 kills on .450 hitting and eight digs against Texas A&M on Sept. 22. She recorded a match-high 15 digs and added six kills at Texas Tech on Sept. 15. Houghtelling was the MVP of the Ameritas Players Challenge, hitting .535 and averaging 4.167 kills, 3.00 digs and 0.67 blocks per game. She recorded a season-high 15 kills on .519 hitting and nine digs in the sweep of New Mexico State. Houghtelling had 12 kills and hit .379 against No. 17 Cal Poly. She topped NU in digs in both matches at the AVCA Showcase en route to Big 12 Defensive Player-of-the-Week honors, highlighted by a career-best 23 digs against No. 5 UCLA on Aug. 25. She was the 2005 AVCA Player of the Year, averaging 3.69 kills, 2.49 digs and 1.03 blocks per game in helping the Huskers to 33 wins and an NCAA finals appearance. She also was a first-team academic All-American who carries a 3.90 GPA entering her final college semester.

**S - #12 Rachel Holloway: 5-10, So., Franklin, Tenn.**

Holloway is one of five returning AVCA All-Americans in the Husker lineup and held her job despite a strong challenge from senior Maggie Griffin. She is playing at an exceptionally high level, leading the Big 12 in assists (13.45) while adding 2.53 digs and 0.98 kills per game. She guides an offense that leads the country in kills, assists and hitting percentage and that has hit .300 or better 11 times in 13 matches. Holloway had 43 assists and eight digs in a sweep of No. 17 K-State on Oct. 3. She totaled 39 assists, three aces and six digs against Baylor on Sept. 29, as Nebraska hit .500 as a team. She played one of the best matches of her career vs. No. 7 Texas on Sept. 11, dishing out 39 assists as NU hit .400 as a team while also adding six kills and six digs. She has two double-doubles on the year - a 35-assist, 12-dig outing against Creighton on Aug. 31 and a 61-assist, 16-dig effort against No. 5 UCLA on Aug. 25. Holloway had a solid performance against New Mexico State, totaling 39 assists, eight digs, six kills and four blocks as NU hit .409 against the Aggies. Holloway was a third-team All-American in 2006, averaging 13.43 assists, 2.49 digs and 1.11 kills per game, finishing 11th nationally in assists. Holloway became only the second freshman in NCAA history to be a starting setter for a title team.

**Last Time Out: NU Picks Up 11th Straight Sweep**

Sarah Pavan's 16 kills led three Huskers in double figures, as the top-ranked Nebraska volleyball team rolled to a 30-16, 30-16, 30-25 sweep of No. 17 Kansas State.

Pavan totaled 16 kills on .364 hitting and a season-high five blocks, as the Huskers improved to 13-0 overall and 6-0 in Big 12 action with their 11th consecutive sweep. Pavan's 16 kills also matched her highest total in conference play.

Wednesday's win was NU's 63rd straight home triumph, matching the school mark originally set between 1999 and 2002.

Pavan, the reigning AVCA National Player of the Year, was one of three Huskers to eclipse season bests against K-State. Sophomore Kori Cooper continued her string of impressive efforts, as she totaled 11 kills without an error on 16 swings and paced NU with a team-high seven blocks. Cooper's blocks were not only a season best, but the highest total by any Husker in 2007. In addition, Christina Houghtelling paced NU with a season-high three aces and paced the Huskers with 13 digs while adding seven kills in the victory.

**Huskers Have Been Dominant in 2007**

While Nebraska is one of five remaining undefeated teams in the country, the Huskers have rarely been challenged despite playing a schedule that has featured six ranked opponents.

- Nebraska and Florida are the only two programs of the undefeated five which have not gone five games. NU has dropped only one game all season - a 30-22 setback to No. 5 UCLA on Aug. 25 - and has swept its last 11 opponents.

- Nebraska has held its opponent to 20 points or less in 23 of 40 games (58 percent), including three sweeps (Tennessee, No. 17 Cal Poly, Texas Tech and Baylor) where the opponent did not exceed 20 points in any game.

- Of the 40 games the Huskers have played, Nebraska has surrendered 25 points only four times and no more than once in any of its first 13 matches.

**Caution: Milestones Approaching**

A number of Huskers are quickly approaching milestones as we head to the the halfway point of the 2007 campaign.

- - Rachel Holloway became the ninth Husker in school history to dish out 2,000 assists, as she passed the plateau against K-State on Wednesday. Holloway, whose career average of 13.43 assists per game is the best in school history, now has 2,041 career assists.

- - Tracy Stalls became the 11th Husker to reach 500 career blocks last month and is one block away from tying Allison Weston for 10th place on NU's career blocks list with 506.

- - Jordan Larson has 931 career kills and is 69 away from becoming the 19th Husker to ever reach the 1,000-kill plateau. Larson also recorded her 111th career ace against K-State on Wednesday, moving into a tie for 10th on that list.

- - With 1,698 career kills, Sarah Pavan is 81 kills away from breaking Allison Weston's school record for most kills in a career.

**Two AVCA Players of the Year in the Same Lineup ...Never Happened Before 2007**

With Sarah Pavan winning the AVCA National Player-of-the-Year Award in 2006, Nebraska has now had four AVCA National Players of the Year, including three this decade. With the return of 2005 AVCA National Player of the Year Christina Houghtelling to the lineup this year, the Huskers are the first team in NCAA volleyball history to field two former AVCA National Players of the Year on the court at one time.

Pavan and Houghtelling look to become only the fifth player in college volleyball history to win the AVCA honor more than once, joining Logan Tom (Stanford, 2001-02); Misty May (Long Beach State, 1997-98); Tara Cross (Long Beach State, 1988-89) and Tee Williams (Hawaii, 1987-89).

**Nebraska Looks to Join Repeat Club**

This fall, the Huskers will look to join an elite list, as only five programs have repeated as national champions. The most recent was USC, which took home back-to-back titles in both 2002 and 2003.

### Nebraska at No. 1 - It's a Record

Nebraska has now spent 78 weeks all-time at No. 1 in the AVCA poll, including 23 consecutive polls dating back to the start of last season. To help put NU's No. 1 rankings into perspective,

- Nebraska's 23 straight weeks at No. 1 is the second-longest streak in AVCA poll history, trailing only the 24 straight weeks that USC spent in the top position between 2002 and 2004.

- NU has spent 59 weeks at No. 1 since the 2000 season, which is more than any other program has spent in the top spot since the AVCA Poll began in 1982.

- The Huskers have played their last 86 matches as the nation's No. 1 team, going 82-4 in that stretch.

Nebraska is one of two teams to be ranked in the AVCA Coaches poll for all 358 weeks of its existence. The Huskers have been ranked in the top 10 for 324 weeks, which trails only Stanford's 328 weeks in the top 10.

### No Place Like Home

From Lincoln to Omaha to North Platte, Nebraska has enjoyed overwhelming support across the state. The Huskers have won their last 67 matches in the state, including matches in Omaha and North Platte, dating back to 2004.

A three-time All-American, Pavan will look to become only the fourth player in NCAA history - and the first Husker - to become a four-time, first-team All-American. She has continued her outstanding play throughout 2007.

John Baylor enters his 13th year as the voice of the Nebraska volleyball program and brings his high-energy broadcasts throughout the state. He is joined in the broadcast booth by color analysts Lindsay Wischmeier-Peterson and Diane Mendenhall.

In addition to broadcasting Husker matches, the Husker Sports Network also produces Sports Nightly, a daily, live call-in show focusing on NU athletics and other area sports. The show runs from 6 to 9 p.m. (central) across the state. During the season, Coach Cook will join Sports Nightly's Lane Grindle for a half-hour, call-in show on Husker volleyball. The show will air on Tuesday nights throughout the season from 7-7:30 p.m. began Aug. 28,

Coach Cook is also heard weekly on B107.3 FM on Friday mornings during the 8 a.m. hour.

State and No. 17 Cal Poly. She finished with 17 kills on a season-high .483 hitting against Cal Poly.

- Shined in NU's Big 12 opener against No. 7 Texas, totaling a team-best 16 kills while hitting a season-high .520 against the Longhorns. It was the first time she hit at least .500 in a match since the 2006 NCAA Regional against No. 16 San Diego.

- Torched No. 17 Kansas State for 16 kills on .364 hitting and a season-high five blocks in a sweep of the Wildcats.

In addition to her volleyball accomplishments, Pavan maintains a perfect 4.0 GPA in biochemistry and was the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American of the Year in Division I in 2006-07. She is on pace to graduate in May of 2008.

### Pavan Meets the Challenge

Throughout her career, All-American Sarah Pavan has saved her best performances for NU's toughest tests. In 47 career matches against ranked foes, Pavan is averaging 4.70 kills per game, well above her career average of 4.50 kills per game for all matches. This season, she is averaging 5.16 kills per game on .356 hitting in six matches against ranked opponents.

With her selection as the Honda-Broderick Cup winner in June of 2007, Nebraska's Sarah Pavan became just the fourth volleyball player to win one of the most coveted awards in college athletics. She became the first Nebraska student-athlete to be selected and is the Big 12's first winner of the award, which recognizes individual and team accomplishments as well as academic excellence.

### She's Back: Houghttelling Returns to '05 Form

After missing all of last season after shoulder surgery, it has not taken outside hitter Christina Houghttelling long to get back into the swing of things. The senior from Cambridge is third on the team averaging 3.15 kills per game and is seventh in the conference with a team-high 3.92 digs per game.

Houghttelling has been honored twice for her performances, winning the Ameritas Players Challenge MVP award, as she totaled 25 kills and just two errors on 43 swings and averaged 3.00 digs per game in a pair of sweeps. She hit over .500 in both matches, including a season-high .562 (10-1-16) against No. 11 Duke. It was her best offensive performance since the 2005 NCAA regional title match against Florida.

Houghttelling was the Big 12's inaugural Defensive Player of the Week following the AVCA Showcase, averaging 5.00 digs and 0.86 blocks per game, highlighted by a career-high 23 digs in the Huskers victory over No. 5 UCLA. She has three of double-doubles, which is even more impressive since she has only had 20 swings in a match three times in NU's last eight contests.

### Air Larson Provides All-Around Skills

While the Huskers return a pair of AVCA National Players of the Year, NU's most valuable all-around performer could be junior outside hitter Jordan Larson. A first-team All-American in 2006, Larson is second on the squad in both kills (3.72) and digs (3.38) per game, ranking 10th in kills and also fifth in service aces (.43).

Larson, who had 22 double-doubles last season, has continued the pace this season, recording six in the Huskers' first 12 contests, upping her career total to 33. She posted two straight double-doubles, including a season-high 17 kills, 11 digs and three aces in a sweep of Kansas on Sept. 26. She totaled 15 kills and 10 digs in NU's sweep of Texas A&M on Sept. 22 and had a 16 kills and added 14 digs against No. 11 Duke on Sept. 7.

### The Set-Up on Holloway

Sophomore Rachel Holloway guides one of the most prolific offensive attacks in college volleyball. The sophomore earned All-America honors in 2006 and leads the Big 12 and ranks 10th nationally this fall with 13.35 assists per game, while also averaging 2.53 digs and 0.98 kills per game.

She guides a Husker attack that leads the country in kills per game, assists per game and hitting percentage, as NU looks to break single-season marks in all three categories this season. All five of her hitters are hitting above .300 and averaging at least 2.47 kills per game.

Holloway has helped NU hit above .300 11 times in 13 matches against one of the most difficult schedules in the country. Holloway totaled a season-high 61 assists against fifth-ranked UCLA on Aug. 25 - one of two matches with at least 50 assists this season. She enjoyed one of her best all-around matches against New Mexico State on Sept. 8, dishing out 39 assists as NU hit a season-high .407 while also adding eight digs and season-bests in both kills (six) and blocks (four). Against No. 7 Texas on Sept. 12, Holloway was nearly flawless, dishing out 39 assists and adding six kills to help NU hit .400 as a team against the Longhorns. The Huskers' .400 hitting night against Texas marked NU's best effort against a top-10 opponent since 2001.

Against Baylor on Sept. 29, Holloway guided NU to a .500 team hitting percentage - the highest by a Husker team since 2001. All five of NU's primary attackers hit over .450, while Kori Cooper, Sarah Pavan and Christina Houghttelling all reached double figures in kills.

### Pavan and Larson are Dealing Aces

Both Sarah Pavan and Jordan Larson are quickly climbing NU's top-10 list for aces. Pavan enters the weekend in eighth place with 115 aces, while Larson moved onto NU's top-10 list Wednesday night against Kansas State.

**A Harbinger of Things to Come?**

Traditionally, the winner of the AVCA Showcase has fared well in the postseason, and the Huskers will look to continue that trend in 2007. **Huskers Continue Big 12 Dominance**

Nebraska's Big 12 title in 2006 continues one of the most successful runs in NCAA history. The Huskers have won nine Big 12 titles in the last 11 years and 28 Big Eight/Big 12 crowns in 31 years. Over the last decade, Nebraska is 212-14 in Big 12 matches, including 141-5 under Head Coach John Cook.

**Nebraska: All-America U**

Nebraska continued its string of All-America success in 2006 with four Huskers earning AVCA All-America accolades. Rachel Holloway, Jordan Larson, Sarah Pavan and Tracy Stalls were all selected, increasing Nebraska's NCAA-leading totals to 29 players and 57 certificates, respectively. Nebraska has had at least one All-American every season since 1983, a total of 25 straight seasons, including 22 in Cook's seven seasons.

**Cook's Winning Ways**

Nebraska Coach John Cook has been amazingly successful during his tenure, posting a 233-14 record (.942 winning percentage). All 14 losses have come against teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament, including the eventual NCAA champion in 2001 (Stanford), 2002 (USC) and 2005 (Washington).

A two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year, Cook has enjoyed greater success in the Big 12, going 141-5 in conference play in his eight years at Nebraska. The Huskers have won six Big 12 titles over the last seven seasons (2000-02, 2004-06) and have dropped just 49 of the 478 conference games they have played over the past six years, good for an .897 winning percentage.

**Nebraska Coliseum: Sold Out for 2007**

Coming off a national title, it was no coincidence that interest in Nebraska volleyball is at an all-time high.

When single-match tickets at the NU Coliseum went on sale on Aug. 1, they were scooped up in 45 minutes, insuring that Nebraska's NCAA record streak of Coliseum sellouts would reach triple figures by the end of the year. Fans began camping out in front of the ticket office 16

hours before tickets went on sale. Prior to this season, the quickest NU had ever sold out its Coliseum matches was nine days.

The Huskers will carry a streak of 98 consecutive sellouts at the NU Coliseum into next Wednesday's contest with Iowa State. The streak began with a 10-game stretch to close the 2001 campaign, and has carried over through the last five seasons.

**Husker Volleyball: Drawing a Crowd**

The Nebraska volleyball program has shown its ability to be one of the top draws in college women's athletics. Not only do the Huskers enjoy an NCAA record volleyball sellout streak, but they have also played in front of the three largest crowds in the country this year. Nebraska's match against Penn State in Omaha on Sept. 2 drew an NCAA regular-season record crowd of 13,081, shattering the old mark of 12,504 by Nebraska in 2000.

The new record will likely be in the books for only a couple more weeks, as Nebraska's match with Hawaii on Oct. 21 is sold out. NU stopped ticket sales at nearly 13,000, with the remaining tickets set aside for UNL students.

**Success in the Classroom**

Nebraska continued to excel in the classroom in 2006, as Sarah Pavan was named the CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year, not only in volleyball, but in all sports in the University division. She became the second Husker student-athlete to ever receive this distinction and the first since former Husker Rob Zatechka in 1994.

The Huskers have had 29 academic All-Americans in volleyball, including at least one in 19 of the past 23 seasons. In July, Nebraska was also awarded the AVCA GamePlan Academic Team award for the 12th time, the most of any Division I program.

Pavan may meet her toughest test to repeat as Academic All-American of the Year from her own team. NU's lineup includes three senior All-Americans with GPAs of 3.90 or better in Pavan (4.00 in biochemistry), Tracy Stalls (3.946 in an individualized program of studies) and Christina Houghtelling (3.90 in elementary education).

**Huskers Join 1,000 Win Club**

With the season-opening victory over Tennessee at the AVCA Showcase on Aug. 25, Nebraska became just the third program in NCAA Division I history to reach the 1,000-win plateau, joining UCLA and Missouri State. The Huskers' win over UCLA in the championship match of the AVCA Showcase marked the first-ever meeting between programs with 1,000 wins.

**Lincoln** – The top-ranked Nebraska volleyball team welcomed the return of sophomore Kori Cooper to the lineup with an emphatic statement, sweeping Baylor, 30-15, 30-12, 30-13 at the Nebraska Coliseum.

Cooper matched her career high with 12 kills without an error on 17 swings, good for a career-high .706 hitting percentage. Cooper was one of three Huskers to record at least 10 kills against the Bears. Sarah Pavan led NU with 13 kills on .476 hitting and three aces, while Christina Houghttelling totaled 12 kills and a match-high 16 digs for her third double-double.

The Huskers (12-0, 5-0 Big 12) hit an eye-popping .500 as a team on 94 swings with every starting attacker hitting over .450 in the process. Rachel Holloway dished out 39 assists and added a career-high three service aces, six digs and three kills in helping NU to its best single-match hitting night since 2001.

**Huskers Match Home Mark with Win over KSU**

**Lincoln** —Sarah Pavan's 16 kills led three Huskers in double figures, as the top-ranked Nebraska volleyball team rolled to a 30-16, 30-16, 30-25 sweep of No. 17 Kansas State.

Pavan totaled 16 kills on .364 hitting and a season-high five blocks, as the Huskers improved to 13-0 overall and 6-0 in Big 12 action with their 11th consecutive sweep. Pavan's 16 kills also matched her highest total in conference play.

Wednesday's win was NU's 63rd straight home triumph, matching the school mark originally set between 1999 and 2002.

Pavan, the reigning AVCA National Player of the Year, was one of three Huskers to eclipse season bests against K-State. Sophomore Kori Cooper continued her string of impressive efforts, as she totaled 11 kills without an error on 16 swings and paced NU with a team-high seven blocks. Cooper's blocks were not only a season best, but the highest total by any Husker in 2007. In addition, Christina Houghttelling paced NU with a season-high three aces and paced the Huskers with 13 digs while adding seven kills in the victory.
