HUSKERS HIT THE ROAD FOR THIRD TIME IN FOUR WEEKS

The 18th-ranked Nebraska softball team wraps up a stretch of 11 consecutive Big Ten Conference games with a three-game series against Purdue in West Lafayette, Ind., this weekend. The teams open their series at 3 p.m. (Central) on Friday, before facing off at Noon (Central) on Saturday and 10 a.m. (Central) on Sunday. A free live radio broadcast will be available for all three games on Huskers.com.

The Huskers have posted a 6-2 record through the first eight games of their 11-game stretch of conference matchups. The success has come against three of the Big Ten's top teams. Nebraska began the stretch by posting a 2-1 record at Iowa, which at No. 22 is the third-highest ranked team in the NCAA RPI rankings, behind Michigan (No. 10) and Nebraska (No. 15). The Huskers then won 2-of-3 games at home against Wisconsin last weekend, the fourth-highest ranked Big Ten team with a No. 25 RPI ranking. On Tuesday, Nebraska swept a mid-week doubleheader from Minnesota, the 33rd-ranked team in the RPI and the fifth-highest Big Ten squad.

The sweep of the Golden Gophers also helped Nebraska move into second place in the Big Ten Conference standings. The Huskers entered the doubleheader one-half game behind Minnesota in third place in the league standings. But junior Taylor Edwards helped Nebraska move ahead of Minnesota by hitting a double and a home run in the game one victory. Edwards scored the Huskers' first two runs to tie the game, before freshman Dawna Tyson was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the fifth inning to force in the winning run in Nebraska's 3-2 victory.

The Huskers then created some space between themselves and Minnesota with the sweep. Game two was the Tatum Edwards' show, as the junior fired a three-hit shutout with nine strikeouts in the circle, while producing all of the scoring with a sixth-inning grand slam in Nebraska's 4-0 win. With the doubleheader sweep, Nebraska improved to 32-9 on the season and moved to 10-3 in conference play. The Huskers trail league-leading Michigan (13-0) by three games, but Nebraska hosts the Wolverines at Bowlin Stadium next weekend. NU is a game-and-a-half ahead of Minnesota in second place.

Nebraska hopes to maintain pace with Michigan in the conference standings and perhaps gain ground on the Wolverines this weekend. The Huskers are hitting the road for the third time in the past four weekends of conference play. NU has won each of its three Big Ten road series this season, earning a 2-1 series victory each time. Purdue enters this weekend in eighth place in the league standings with a 7-7 Big Ten record. The Boilermakers have won four of their last five Big Ten Conference games.

HUSKERS TO WATCH



Alicia Armstrong, Fr., INF

Armstrong has hit safely in nine straight games, going 15-for-30 (.500) during that stretch to raise her season batting average to a team-leading .369 mark. Armstrong also leads NU and ranks eighth in the Big Ten with a .462 average (18-for-39) in league play. She is 6-for-11 with three RBIs while hitting leadoff the past three games.



Taylor Edwards, Jr., C

Edwards has reached base safely in 22 consecutive games. She has collected 25 hits, 16 walks and been hit by six pitches to post a .566 on-base percentage during the streak, while still producing seven doubles, seven homers and 22 RBIs. In Big Ten play, Edwards leads NU and ranks fifth in the league with a .627 on-base percentage.

SCOUTING THE PURDUE BOILERMAKERS (20-23 OVERALL, 7-7 BIG TEN)

Purdue enters this weekend's series with a 20-23 record. The Boilermakers are in eighth place in the Big Ten Conference standings with a 7-7 league record. Purdue has won four of its last five conference games, all by at least four runs. Since a Big Ten-opening sweep at undefeated Michigan, Purdue has gone 7-4, with the four losses in that stretch coming by a combined eight runs, including two one-run losses and a two-run loss in extra innings.

Purdue is batting .274 as a team and averaging 4.2 runs per game, but in conference play, the Boilermakers are hitting .283 and averaging 5.4 runs per game. Andie Varsho leads the team and ranks fifth in the Big Ten with a .436 batting average. She has added 10 doubles, two triples and three home runs while producing 34 RBIs. Varsho also leads in the league with 25 stolen bases. Ashley Burkhardt and Lindsey Rains also rank in the top five in the conference with 17 and 21 stolen bases, respectively, as the Boilermakers lead the Big Ten and rank fifth nationally with 100 stolen bases. In addition to being prolific base stealers, Burkhardt is batting .329 and has struck out only seven times in 152 at bats this season. Rains is hitting .290 and has produced 18 RBIs. Three other Boilermakers are hitting above .250, while Danielle Fletcher - who homered in the first meeting with Nebraska this season - is Purdue's top power threat, slugging six home runs and producing 27 RBIs.

In the circle, Purdue boasts a 3.02 staff ERA, while allowing an average of 3.4 runs per game. The Boilermakers have primarily relied on the duo of Lilly Fecho and Lexy Moore, often relying on both pitchers to appear in the same game. Fecho, the reigning Big Ten Pitcher of the Week, is 8-13 with a 2.69 ERA in 130.1 innings. Moore is 8-9 with a 3.62 ERA in 112.0 innings and opponents are hitting .274 against her. Alex Whittemore (2-0, 2.10 ERA in 26.2 IP) and Erika Petrucci (2-1, 3.00 ERA in 16.1 IP) round out the Purdue staff. In Big Ten play, the staff boasts a 3.90 ERA and is allowing 4.8 runs per game. Fecho has allowed seven of her 12 home runs in conference action, and she is the only Boilermaker with an ERA under 4.00 in league play.

HUSKER HISTORY VS. PURDUE

Purdue leads the all-time series with Nebraska, 2-1. The Boilermakers won the first two meetings in 1996 (4-2) and 1999 (6-2), before the Huskers defeated Purdue 4-3 in non-conference play this season at the Hillenbrand Invitational in Tucson, Ariz., on Feb. 17. This weekend's series will mark the first time the teams have met as Big Ten Conference opponents, as the Huskers and Boilermakers did not play each other last season. The series will also mark the first home games for either team, as each of the first three meetings were played at a neutral site. Nebraska Head Coach Rhonda Revelle is 1-2 in her career against Purdue and 1-0 against eighth-year Boilermaker Head Coach Kim Maher.

The teams' first meeting this season marked the 10th game of the year for both teams. Nebraska overcame a sloppy performance to rally for the victory. The Huskers won despite trailing 3-0, committing four errors and being out-hit, 8-5. Freshman right-hander Emily Lockman earned the start and allowed three runs (one earned) in 4.0 innings of work. She left the game with Nebraska trailing 3-0, before the Huskers scored twice in the bottom of the fourth inning on a two-run home run from senior Brooke Thomason. Junior right-hander Tatum Edwards entered the game in the top of the fifth and held Purdue scoreless while scattering four hits over the final 3.0 innings.

With Edwards keeping the Boilermakers off the scoreboard, Nebraska tied the game at 3-3 in the bottom of the fifth thanks to an RBI single from Alicia Armstrong. The Huskers took a 4-3 lead in the bottom of the sixth when freshman Hailey Decker delivered a sacrifice fly. Nebraska then survived a tense seventh inning to hang on for the win and match the best 10-game start in school history at 9-1. The Boilermakers loaded the bases with one out on an error, an infield single and a hit batter. But Nebraska escaped the jam, recording a force out at home for the second out before a ground out preserved the victory.

QUICK HITTERS

- The information below provides a quick glimpse of a few statistics and brief notes heading into this weekend:
- ▶ Nebraska owns an all-time record of 485-235 (.673) in the month of April. NU is 7-2 in April this season.
 - ▶ NU was ranked 15th in the fourth NCAA RPI ranking released Monday. The Huskers were the second-highest ranked Big Ten team behind No. 10 Michigan, while overall the conference had five teams ranked in the top 33.
 - ▶ NU's roster features seven freshmen, tying for the most freshmen in Coach Revelle's 21 seasons (also 2008).
 - ▶ Five freshmen started the season opener, the most in Coach Revelle's tenure and believed to be the most ever.
 - ▶ NU's starting lineup has featured at least three freshmen in every game, including 16 games with five freshmen.
 - ▶ The freshmen have combined for 26 extra-base hits, the ninth-highest total by a freshman class in school history.
 - ▶ Nebraska has allowed one run or less in 22 of its 41 games this season, including 13 shutouts. In 55 games last season, NU allowed one run or less just 16 times, posting 13 shutouts.
 - ▶ Five Huskers have started all 41 games at the same position this spring (Taylor Edwards - C, Hailey Decker - 2B, Gabby Banda - 3B, Kiki Stokes - CF, Brooke Thomason - RF).
 - ▶ Nebraska is 27-1 when out-hitting its opponent this season.
 - ▶ The Huskers are 29-3 when recording at least five hits.
 - ▶ NU is 23-0 when it scores first and 14-0 when it scores in the first inning.
 - ▶ Nebraska is 17-0 when it scores five-or-more runs.
 - ▶ NU is 22-0 when leading after four innings.
 - ▶ The Huskers are 3-0 in extra-innings this season and have won six straight extra-inning games.
 - ▶ In the circle, 41 of the 102 hits Tatum Edwards has allowed this season have been infield singles (40 percent).
 - ▶ Offensively, 15 of Tatum Edwards' 21 hits have gone for extra bases, including seven doubles and eight homers.
 - ▶ Tatum Edwards enters this weekend with 99 career RBIs, one shy of 100.
 - ▶ Gabby Banda is one double shy of cracking Nebraska's all-time top 10.
 - ▶ Banda has started 176 consecutive games for the Huskers.
 - ▶ Taylor Edwards has hit 33 career home runs and Brooke Thomason 31 home runs, giving Nebraska a lineup that features two players with 30 career home runs for only the second time in school history (also 1998). NU has never had a lineup with three players with 30 career homers and Tatum Edwards owns 29 career home runs.
 - ▶ The Edwards twins have homered in the same game nine times in their careers, including twice in 2013.

THOMASON & TAYLOR EDWARDS RANK AMONG NATION'S ACTIVE CAREER LEADERS

Senior Brooke Thomason and junior Taylor Edwards have put up outstanding offensive statistics in their careers, helping Thomason rank in the top 10 in school history in seven offensive categories and Edwards rank in the top 10 in Husker history in four offensive categories. The duo have not only posted totals among the best in Nebraska history, but they have also produced statistics that rank highly among all active Division I softball players.

Of the approximately 5,000 current Division I softball players, Thomason has produced statistics that rank among the top one percent (50 players) of all players in five categories. Entering this week, she ranked 20th among all active players with 156 career RBIs, 31st with 40 doubles, 45th with 87 walks and 50th with 194 hits and a .329 batting average.

Edwards has also produced numbers that rank among the top one percent of all current college softball players in three categories, an impressive feat considering her junior status. Entering this week, Edwards ranked 21st among all active players with 101 career walks and 25th with 145 RBIs, while also ranking 50th with 32 home runs. Edwards ranked second among all current players not in their senior season in walks, and she was fourth in RBIs and tied for ninth in home runs.

TAYLOR EDWARDS JOINS 100-100-100 CLUB

Junior Taylor Edwards went 4-for-8 with a double, a home run, four RBIs and three runs scored against Wisconsin last weekend. Her two runs scored in Sunday's 11-2 win gave her 101 career runs scored, making her the 10th Husker to produce 100 career hits, runs scored and RBIs. Edwards joined three-time All-American Ali Viola and Crystal Carwile as the only players in school history to reach each milestone prior to their senior season.

ROAD WARRIORS

Nebraska is 11-4 on the road this season, with a win at No. 1 Oklahoma that snapped the Sooners' 17-game, season-opening win streak. Two of NU's road losses have come to ranked teams (No. 1 Oklahoma and No. 16 Arizona). The Huskers' 11 road victories are tied for the third-most in school history. This year's group could challenge the school record of 14 road victories. One win this weekend would tie for the second-most road wins in school history while a sweep would tie the Nebraska record for most road victories in a season. Included in this year's success was a streak of six consecutive road victories, the fourth-longest streak in school history. Nebraska was just 7-12 on the road last year, including a 4-8 road record in Big Ten Conference play. The Huskers are 4-2 in conference road games this spring.

A LOOK AT THE PROBABLE LINEUP

- 1 ALICIA ARMSTRONG, SS (40 STARTS, .369, 8 2B, 2 HR, 12 RBIs)**
Armstrong has started 40 games at shortstop this spring, missing one game with an ankle injury. Armstrong, a three-sport all-state selection as a high school senior, is focusing on softball for the first time after setting Nebraska state records with a .690 average as a senior and a .514 career mark.
- 2 GABBY BANDA, 3B (41 STARTS, .257, 4 2B, 0 HR, 16 RBIs)**
Banda is in her third season as NU's starting third baseman and fourth season as a starter on the left side of the infield. A third-team All-Big Ten selection in 2012, Banda led NU with a career-high .352 average and 14 doubles in 2012. She has started 206 games in her Husker career, including 176 straight.
- 3 TAYLOR EDWARDS, C (41 STARTS, .359, 11 2B, 10 HR, 41 RBIs)**
The only All-America catcher in school history, Edwards set NU freshman records with 18 homers and 67 RBIs in 2011 while earning third-team All-America honors. In 2012, she walked a school-record 40 times. She set the school record with 8 RBIs against Illinois-Chicago on Feb. 9, when she hit two grand slams.
- 4 BROOKE THOMASON, RF (41 STARTS, .341, 9 2B, 5 HR, 37 RBIs)**
An All-Big 12 selection in 2010 and All-Big Ten pick in 2012, Thomason ranks third in NU history with 156 RBIs and fifth in homers (31) and extra-base hits (71). Thomason is the first player in school history to produce four 30-RBI seasons and is just the fifth Husker with 30 career doubles and 30 home runs.
- 5 HAILEY DECKER, 2B (41 STARTS, .229, 6 2B, 4 HR, 20 RBIs)**
Decker has started all 41 games at second and became the third player in school history to homer in her first career at bat. Twice named the Oregon Offensive Player of the Year, Decker posted a .599 career prep average. Her father Steve is the coordinator of minor league hitting instruction for the San Francisco Giants.
- 6 MATTIE FOWLER, 1B (33 STARTS, .287, 2 2B, 3 HR, 18 RBIs)**
Fowler started every game as a freshman, including 49 starts at shortstop. She tore her ACL last summer and has moved to first base. She was limited early, but has started 32 games at first, including 24 straight. She owns eight game-winning RBIs in her career, including three in the seventh inning or later.
- 7 COURTNEY BREAUULT, DP (6 STARTS, .161, 1 2B, 1 HR, 4 RBIs)**
Breault battled through injuries to emerge as the second-team All-Big Ten second baseman in her first year at NU in 2012. This year, Breault has earned six starts as the designated player, while also being a top pinch hitter. She has produced three of her five hits and three of her four RBIs in Big Ten play.
- 8 JORDAN BETTIOL, LF (38 STARTS, .250, 2 2B, 0 HR, 5 RBIs)**
Bettiol has started 38 games in left field, after making 18 outfield starts and 20 total starts as a freshman in 2012. A first-team high school All-American as a senior, Bettiol reached base at a .389 clip in 2012 and scored 17 runs, while batting .267. She has doubled twice this season in limited time in the batting order.
- 9 KIKI STOKES, CF (41 STARTS, .287, 0 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBIs)**
One of the fastest players in school history, Stokes was a three-time NFCA High School All-American and two-time, first-team honoree who set Olathe East High School records with a .605 career batting average, 181 hits, 163 runs scored and 87 stolen bases. She hit an inside-the-park home run at Wichita State.
- 10 TATUM EDWARDS, P (28 STARTS, .259, 7 2B, 8 HR, 19 RBIs; 24 STARTS, 20-6, 1.82 ERA, 149 Ks, 154.0 IP)**
Edwards plays a key dual role for NU this spring. In the circle, the two-time 2012 Big Ten Pitcher of the Week has allowed one earned run or less in 44 of 64 career appearances. At the plate, she is a two-time all-conference honoree who ranks sixth in NU history with a .567 career slugging percentage.
- OR EMILY LOCKMAN, P (18 STARTS, 12-3, 1.52 ERA, 74 Ks, 106.0 IP)**
The 2012 California Gatorade Player of the Year and first-team high school All-American, Lockman went 74-19 in her prep career with a 0.89 ERA. The Big Ten ERA leader has thrown three shutouts in 2013, including the first no-hitter by a Husker freshman since 2003 and a shutout of No. 1 Oklahoma.
- P DANICA BISHOP (0 STARTS, 0-0, 1.75 ERA, 5 Ks, 8.0 IP)**
A hard worker making great strides in her pitching development, Bishop serves as Nebraska's No. 3 pitcher this spring. She was an all-county all-star as a senior for Woodbridge High School.
- IF KYLEE MUIR (9 STARTS, .273, 3 2B, 1 HR, 5 RBIs)**
After backing up all-conference players at both designated player and first base the past two seasons, Muir has seen more playing time this year, exceeding her career totals in hits, runs and RBIs.
- C SAMMI NOLAND (0 STARTS, .000, 0 2B, 0 HR, 0 RBIs)**
Noland backs up All-American Taylor Edwards behind the plate, while also earning time as both a pinch-hitter and pinch runner. She was a two-time All-Southern Arizona selection in high school.
- OF MEGAN SOUTHWORTH (2 STARTS, .000, 0 2B, 0 HR, 0 RBIs)**
Southworth is competing for playing time in left field, a position where she started a team-high 28 games in 2011. Southworth also owns more pinch hits (8) than the rest of the NU roster combined (6).
- IF DAWNA TYSON (29 STARTS, .296, 0 2B, 3 HR, 16 RBIs)**
Tyson has split time at first base and at DP earning 29 total starts. A two-time All-CIF selection, Tyson has started 23 of the last 28 games, producing 20 hits, three homers and 14 RBIs in that stretch.

LOCKMAN POSTING IMPRESSIVE FRESHMAN TOTALS

Freshman right-hander Emily Lockman is 12-3 this spring with a 1.52 ERA. Lockman leads the Big Ten in ERA, and she ranked second among all freshmen nationally in ERA and 26th overall entering this week. Lockman's 1.52 ERA would currently rank as the third-lowest mark by a freshman in Nebraska history, trailing only two-time All-American Lori Sippel, Lockman's pitching coach, and 2004 All-American Peaches James. Lockman also ranked in a tie for 13th nationally among all freshmen pitchers with 11 wins entering this week, while her current .800 winning percentage would be the third-best mark by a freshman in school history.

TAYLOR EDWARDS ENJOYING BEST CONFERENCE SEASON OF HER CAREER

Junior Taylor Edwards is putting up big numbers in Big Ten Conference play this season, posting a .424 batting average, an .879 slugging percentage and a .627 on-base percentage through Nebraska's first 13 conference games. She leads the Big Ten with six doubles in league games, while ranking third in hit-by-pitches (5), fourth in walks (13), fifth in on-base percentage and RBIs (15), seventh in homers (3) and eighth in total bases (29).

Edwards' production is much improved from her first two conference seasons, when she drew 39 walks in 41 games as teams elected to frequently pitch around her. Edwards has produced six doubles in 13 conference games this season, after totaling just three doubles in her first 41 career conference games. Her 14 hits, 15 RBIs, five hit-by-pitches and 29 total bases are already the highest totals of her conference career.

TAYLOR EDWARDS POST DOUBLE-DIGIT DOUBLES & HOME RUNS

Junior Taylor Edwards doubled and homered in game one of Tuesday's doubleheader against Minnesota, marking her 11th double and 10th home run of the season. She is only the eighth player in school history to produce 10 doubles and 10 home runs in the same season and the first since Heidi Foland and Brooke Thomason both accomplished the feat in 2006. Edwards has a chance to become the first Husker to ever produce 15 doubles and 15 home runs in the same season, needing four more doubles and five more home runs to reach both marks.

From a career standpoint, Edwards owns 30 career doubles and 33 career home runs after Tuesday's doubleheader. She is only the fifth Husker to produce 30 doubles and 30 home runs in a career, joining senior Brooke Thomason, who became a member of the 30-30 club earlier this year.

THOMASON & TAYLOR EDWARDS JOIN 30-30 CLUB

Senior Brooke Thomason and junior Taylor Edwards each eclipsed 30 career doubles and 30 career home runs this spring, becoming the fourth and fifth members, respectively, of Nebraska's 30-30 club. Thomason became the fourth player in school history to produce 30 career doubles and 30 career home runs with a home run against Oregon on Feb. 23. Taylor Edwards became the fifth member of the club when she slugged her 30th career double and 33rd career home run in the same game in game one of a doubleheader against Minnesota on April 16. Edwards and three-time All-American Ali Viola are the only players in school history to join the 30-30 club prior to their senior season. Taylor's twin sister Tatum has an excellent shot to become the sixth member of the 30-30 club before her career is over. Tatum enters this weekend with 24 career doubles and 29 career home runs.

HUSKERS ENJOYING 'GRAND' YEAR

Nebraska has enjoyed hitting with the bases loaded this season, posting a .365 team batting average, a .595 slugging percentage and a .453 on-base percentage with the bases loaded. The Huskers have found numerous ways to drive in runs with the bases loaded, including eight bases-loaded walks and four bases-loaded hit-by-pitches. But NU has also shown the ability to clear the bases with a grand slam, slugging four grand slams this spring. Nebraska's four grand slams in 2013 mark the most by any Husker team since at least 2000, when complete records become available. Junior twins Tatum and Taylor Edwards have combined for three grand slams. Taylor hit two grand slams in the same game against Illinois-Chicago on Feb. 9, becoming the fourth player in NCAA history to hit two grand slams in the same game. Tatum hit her grand slam against Minnesota on April 16, while senior Brooke Thomason hit her third career grand slam on Feb. 16 against Utah State.

ARMSTRONG RIDING NINE-GAME HIT STREAK, EXCELLING IN BIG TEN PLAY

Junior Alicia Armstrong has hit safely in nine straight games, dating back to an 0-for-2 day against Illinois on March 31. The streak is the longest of her career and the longest by a Husker this season. If she can collect a hit at Purdue on Friday, Armstrong would be the first Husker to post a 10-game hitting streak since Nikki Haget hit safely in 12 straight games during the 2011 season. Armstrong is 15-for-30 during her hitting streak, raising her season batting average from a mark of .321 at the beginning of the streak to its current team-high mark of .369.

Armstrong has not only excelled over her last nine games, but she has been excellent during Big Ten Conference play. Armstrong has hit safely in 11 of Nebraska's 13 conference games this spring. She is batting a team-high .462 in conference play, a mark that ranks eighth in the league. Her recent hot streak has elevated Armstrong from ninth in the batting order to the leadoff spot. Armstrong has hit leadoff the past three games, going 6-for-11 during that stretch with three RBIs, two runs scored and one stolen base.

TAYLOR EDWARDS SETS THREE-YEAR WALK RECORD

Junior Taylor Edwards has walked 26 times this season, pushing her career total to 103 walks, good for fourth in school history. Edwards has already passed three-time All-American Jennifer Lizama for the most walks through a player's first three seasons in school history. Lizama walked 92 times through her junior season. Edwards is only 22 walks from passing Lizama's career record of 124 walks.

Edwards also needs only four more walks to become the first player in school history to draw at least 30 walks in three different seasons. She walked 37 times in 2011 and tied the school record with 40 walks in 2012.

THE PRODUCERS

Nebraska has proven run producers throughout its lineup, but senior Brooke Thomason and junior Taylor Edwards have been especially good at driving in runs in their careers. Thomason owns the most career RBIs of any player in the Big Ten Conference, while Edwards is tied for second on that list. Collectively, the duo also ranks as the nation's sixth-most productive RBI tandem.

Thomason's 156 RBIs not only lead the Big Ten, but her total would be enough to set the school record at Michigan State, Penn State, Purdue and Wisconsin. Despite her junior status, Edwards would already own the career RBI record at Michigan State, Penn State and Wisconsin. Together, Thomason and Edwards have produced 302 career RBIs, 74 more than the Big Ten's second-place tandem (Wisconsin's Shannel Blackshear and Whitney Massey - 228 combined RBIs). Thomason and Edwards are two of only eight current Big Ten players who have produced 100 career RBIs. Nebraska is the only school in the conference with more than one players who has driven in 100 career RBIs, and junior Tatum Edwards could make it three Huskers in the 100-RBI club, as she enters this weekend with 99 career RBIs.

HUSKERS GETTING DEFENSIVE

Nebraska's defense has been much improved this season, after struggling in 2012. The Huskers lead the Big Ten Conference in double plays turned (29) and own the lowest opponent stolen-base percentage (61 percent), while posting the second-best fielding percentage (.965) and allowing the fewest stolen bases (19).

Last year, Nebraska finished with a .954 fielding percentage, committing 67 errors. The fielding percentage was the lowest by a Husker team since 1994, while the 67 errors were the most by an NU squad since 2004. Through 41 games this season, Nebraska has already turned 13 more double plays (29-to-16) than it did all of last year, while the Huskers have committed 10 fewer errors this season than at the same point last year and posting a .015 improvement in fielding percentage.

HUSKER PITCHING ALSO IMPROVED FROM 2012

Led by junior right-hander Tatum Edwards and freshman right-hander Emily Lockman, Nebraska's pitching staff has shown great improvement from last year. The Huskers' staff ERA has been well over one full run lower after every game this season than it was last year. NU has owned a season ERA below 2.00 following 39 of its 41 games this season, including twice where the Huskers' season ERA was below 1.00. Last year, the lowest Nebraska's season ERA stood after any one game was 2.79. The Huskers have also allowed one run or less in 22 of their 41 games this year, after allowing one run or fewer just 16 times in last season's 55-game schedule.

Nebraska owns six more wins through 41 games this spring than it did a year ago, while boasting a 1.42 lower ERA. The Huskers have also posted four more shutouts this year than they had at the same point last year, while matching last year's season total of 13 shutouts. NU has also allowed 53 fewer runs than at this point last year.

Individually, Edwards is 20-6 this season with a 1.82 ERA and eight shutouts in 154.0 innings. Through 41 games last season, Edwards was 7-3 with a 3.02 ERA and two shutouts in 53.1 innings.

HUSKERS BOAST TWO OF BIG TEN'S BEST PITCHERS

Nebraska boasts two of the Big Ten's top pitchers this spring in junior right-hander Tatum Edwards and freshman right-hander Emily Lockman. Together, the duo have helped the Huskers lead the league in ERA (1.70), shutouts (13) and opponent batting average (.205), while ranking second in wins (32). Overall, Nebraska has allowed one run or less in 22 of its 41 games this season.

Edwards is 20-6 with a 1.82 ERA in 154.0 innings. She has established career highs this season in wins, innings, shutouts (8), complete games (19), strikeouts (149) and saves (1). Edwards boasts the fifth-best ERA in the Big Ten, while ranking in a tie for first in shutouts, second in opponent batting average, third in wins, fourth in appearances and starts and fifth in strikeouts, saves and fewest runs allowed. Edwards has not allowed a run in 12 of her 29 appearances in 2013 while not allowing an earned run in 16 games.

Edwards owns a four-hit shutout against No. 23 Florida State, while she also did not allow an earned run in a 1-0 loss at No. 16 Arizona and allowed only two hits and two runs in her first of two starts against No. 1 Oklahoma.

Lockman has also impressed this season. The two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week, Lockman is 12-3 with a 1.52 ERA in 106.0 innings. She leads the Big Ten in ERA and fewest runs allowed, while ranking eighth in opponent batting average and tied for ninth in wins. Lockman has allowed one earned run or less in 12 of her 18 starts this season, while allowing more than two earned runs only twice. She tossed the first no-hitter by a Husker freshman since 2003 in her fourth career start. Lockman has also excelled in her two starts against ranked opponents. Lockman tossed a four-hitter but was on the losing end of a 1-0 decision to eighth-ranked Cal on Feb. 24. Her next start came at No. 1 Oklahoma, when she snapped the Sooners' 17-game season-opening win streak with a seven-hit shutout. She is one of only two pitchers to defeat OU this season, and the only pitcher to shut out the powerful Sooner lineup.

The duo have also excelled during Big Ten Conference play. Nebraska's 2.00 ERA in conference play leads the league, as do the Huskers' 87 strikeouts, 60 hits allowed, 31 runs allowed and .197 opponent batting average. Individually, Lockman leads the league with a 1.95 ERA in conference-only games, while Edwards ranks second with a 2.02 ERA. Edwards also leads the Big Ten with 61 strikeouts in Big Ten play, while ranking third in wins (6) and opponent batting average (.177).

NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS

50 **NCAA TOURNAMENT VICTORIES**
Nebraska has won 50 games in its 20 NCAA Tournament appearances while posting an overall record of 50-42 (.543 winning percentage). The Huskers' 50 wins rank 13th in NCAA history.

29 **ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS**
A total of 21 Huskers have combined to earn 29 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors. That total is the most of any softball program in the country and ranks second among all female athletic programs nationally behind the Nebraska volleyball team (37).

20 **NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES**
In the first 31 years softball has been an NCAA sport, the Huskers have made 20 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 13 straight from 1995 to 2007. Nebraska's 20 postseason appearances rank 12th in NCAA history.

21 **ALL-AMERICANS**
Nebraska has produced 21 All-Americans in school history, including six first-team All-Americans, four two-time honorees and a pair of three-time All-Americans.

18 **CONFERENCE TITLES**
Nebraska has won 18 conference titles in its 36 seasons as a varsity sport. The Huskers won 12 Big Eight titles and six Big 12 crowns and are looking for their first Big Ten title.

15 **ALL-AMERICANS UNDER REVELLE**
In her first 20 years as Nebraska's head coach, Rhonda Revelle has guided 10 players to a total of 15 All-America honors.

13 **TOP-25 NATIONAL FINISHES**
Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 13 of the 18 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

13 **REVELLE'S ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS**
Rhonda Revelle has produced 13 Academic All-Americans in her first 20 seasons as Nebraska's coach. Over that time frame, Revelle has coached more academic All-Americans than any other coach in the country.

6 **WOMEN'S COLLEGE WORLD SERIES**
Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series six times to rank 13th in NCAA history.

6 **TOP 10 ATTENDANCE SEASONS**
In the 11 years the Huskers have called Bowlin Stadium home, Nebraska has ranked in the top 10 nationally in average attendance six times.

TURNING TWO BECOMING ROUTINE

Nebraska has recorded a Big Ten-leading 29 double plays through 41 games this season, including turning at least one double play in eight consecutive games from Feb. 15 to Feb. 23. The Huskers, who rank third nationally in double plays per game, have recorded the most double plays by a Husker team since at least 2000, topping the previous high mark of 22 in 2004. Included in this year's total are six games where the Huskers have turned two double plays.

THOMASON HAS BEEN MISS CONSISTENT

Senior Brooke Thomason has been a consistent performer through her first three full seasons, batting better than .300 each year while producing at least seven home runs and 30 RBIs every year. This spring, Thomason has already produced more than 30 RBIs for the fourth straight season, as she is batting .341 with five home runs and 37 RBIs. Her consistency has been nearly unmatched in school history.

- ▶ Thomason is the only player in school history to produce four 30-RBI seasons. She was the first Husker ever to open her career with three straight 30-RBI seasons, before eclipsing the mark again this spring. The consistent production has helped Thomason rank third in school history with 156 career RBIs.
- ▶ Thomason was the first player in school history to hit seven home runs in each of her first three seasons. Thomason owns five home runs this season in her bid to become the only player in Husker history to produce four seasons with at least seven home runs. Thomason's consistency has helped her rank fifth in school history with 31 career home runs.
- ▶ With a .341 batting average this spring, Thomason is bidding to become the sixth player in school history to bat at least .300 all four seasons of her career. The five players to accomplish that feat (Denise Day, Tobin Echo-Hawk, Jennifer Lizama, Kim Ogee and Ali Viola) each earned All-America honors in their careers and four were multi-time All-Americans, as the group combined for 11 total All-America awards. Thomason ranks 14th in school history with a .3296career average.
- ▶ Thomason's consistency has helped her join a pair of exclusive Nebraska clubs this season. She was only the fourth Husker to produce 30 career doubles and 30 career home runs, before Taylor Edwards became the fifth on April 16. Thomason has an outside chance of joining three-time All-American Ali Viola as the only members of the 40-40 club. Thomason is also one of only 10 players in school history to produce 100 career hits, RBIs and runs scored.

THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Nebraska went 4-1 on its five-game homestand that concluded this week. The Huskers have been tough to beat at Bowlin Stadium in recent years, winning 32 of their last 36 home games dating back to 2011. After winning the final three home games of the 2011 season, Nebraska posted a 15-1 home record in 2012. The Huskers are 11-2 at home this season.

The Huskers have been especially tough at home against Big Ten Conference opponents. Nebraska is 16-2 all-time in Big Ten Conference games at Bowlin Stadium. NU has outscored its opponents 106-40 in its first 18 Big Ten home games, winning by an average of nearly four runs per game.

The Huskers are 6-1 in conference action at Bowlin Stadium this spring, sweeping two-game series from Northwestern and Minnesota and winning 2-of-3 games from Wisconsin. Nebraska posted a 10-1 Big Ten home record last season, losing only to Wisconsin.

This year marks only the second time in school history (also 2003) that a Husker team has featured two players in the club. Taylor Edwards reached each milestone as a junior, joining Crystal Carwile and Ali Viola as the only Huskers to reach each milestone prior to their senior season.

Taylor's twin sister Tatum is a candidate to join the club next year, as she enters this weekend needing one RBI and 20 runs scored to reach the 100-milestone in both categories.

HOME SWEET HOME FOR TATUM EDWARDS

Bowlin Stadium has served as a great home for Tatum Edwards, as the junior right-hander owns a 15-0 career record on her home field. She has thrown 95.2 innings in 19 career appearances at Bowlin Stadium, posting a 1.17 ERA, including seven shutouts in her 13 starts. A native of Murrieta, Calif., Edwards has held opposing hitters to a .153 batting average at Bowlin Stadium, while averaging more than one strikeout per inning.

Edwards has not allowed an earned run in 13 of her 19 career appearances in Lincoln, while allowing more than one earned run only three times. This season, Edwards has not allowed an earned run in eight of her 10 appearances at Bowlin Stadium, including four shutouts in seven starts.

As good as Edwards' numbers at home have been, they're even better when you take out her impromptu appearance against Iowa State in 2011, when starter Ashley Hagemann got sick during the game and Edwards had to fill in on short notice. Edwards allowed six earned runs in 2.1 innings against the Cyclones that day and taking out that appearance, she is 15-0 with a 0.75 ERA in her career at Bowlin Stadium.

FABULOUS FRESHMEN

Nebraska's talented seven-player freshman class has made an immediate impact. The largest freshman class in Head Coach Rhonda Revelle's 21 seasons, the Huskers have started at least three freshmen every game, including 16 contests where five freshmen were in the starting lineup.

Freshmen lead the team in several categories, including Alicia Armstrong, who leads Nebraska with a .369 batting average, Kiki Stokes, who leads Nebraska in runs (36), triples (1) and stolen bases (12), Emily Lockman, who owns Nebraska's best ERA (1.52) and Danica Bishop, who is tied for the team lead in saves (1).

Stokes and Hailey Decker have started every game this season, while Alicia Armstrong has made 40 starts, missing one game due to an ankle injury. Lockman has started 18 games in the circle, while Dawna Tyson has earned 29 starts, 20 as the designated player and nine at first base. Overall, the freshmen have combined for 169 starts this season.

Offensively, the freshmen have combined for a solid .291 batting average with 14 doubles, one triple, 11 home runs and 57 RBIs. The group is slugging .408 and reaching base at a .386 clip. In the circle, Lockman and Bishop have combined for a 12-3 record with three shutouts, one save and a 1.54 ERA. Lockman is 12-3 with a 1.52 ERA in 106.0 innings, leading the Big Ten in ERA. Bishop has made five appearances, posting a 1.75 ERA with one save. She has not allowed an earned run in four of her five appearances, including 1.1 shutout innings of relief against No. 1 Oklahoma.

GIVE ME FIVE

Husker hitting coach Diane Miller asks her hitters to "give her five," meaning score five runs per game. The thought being that NU will win most games if it can score five runs. Nebraska is averaging more than five runs per game this season, but where the Husker offense has really excelled at giving Miller "five" has been during Big Ten Conference play.

Nebraska is 6-0 when scoring at least five runs in Big Ten Conference play this season and 4-3 when failing to score five runs. In their first 36 conference games as a member of the Big Ten dating back to last season, the Huskers have averaged 5.3 runs per game. Nebraska has scored at least five runs in 17 of its 36 Big Ten games, owning a 14-3 record when scoring five runs and a 10-9 mark when failing to score five runs.

Overall this season, NU is 17-0 when scoring five-or-more runs and 13-9 when scoring fewer than five runs.

WINNING TIME

Nebraska has won eight games in its final at bat this season, including four times in an eight-game stretch from March 9 to March 22. Three of the eight wins have come with the Huskers trailing in the seventh or eighth inning, while the other five wins occurred in games where the score was tied in Nebraska's final turn at bat in the game. Three of the wins have been walk-off victories and three have been extra-inning wins.

The Huskers' first win in the final at bat came in the fourth game of the season on Feb. 10. Nebraska trailed Illinois-Chicago 3-2 in the bottom of the eighth inning, before scoring twice in its final at bat, highlighted by sophomore Jordan Bettiol's walk-off, RBI double.

The Huskers would not need another late-inning victory until nearly a month later. At Wichita State on March 9, the game was tied 1-1 with two outs in the top of the seventh inning before the Huskers scored twice, highlighted by freshman Kiki Stokes' go-ahead, two-out, inside-the-park home run. That began the stretch of four final-at bat victories in eight games for the Huskers.

Six days after the win at Wichita State, Stokes delivered again, belting a walk-off three-run homer in the bottom of the 10th inning that gave Nebraska a 4-1 win over New Mexico State. Four days later against UNO, sophomore Mattie Fowler delivered a walk-off, two-run single with two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning to lift Nebraska to a 3-2 come-from-behind victory. Three days after that win, junior Taylor Edwards was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded to bring home the winning run with two outs in the bottom of the eighth inning of a 5-4 win over Northwestern.

The next weekend at Illinois, the Huskers rallied from a 2-1 seventh-inning deficit to post a 6-2 victory. Senior Courtney Breault tied the game with a clutch pinch-hit, RBI single and Stokes' bases-loaded walk gave Nebraska a 3-2 lead. Taylor Edwards then secured the victory with a three-run double. The following weekend at Iowa, the Huskers and Hawkeyes were tied at 2-2 in the top of the seventh, when a two-out rally resulted in Nebraska scoring the winning run on an error.

In game two of a doubleheader with Minnesota on April 16, Tatum Edwards hit a grand slam with two outs in the bottom of the sixth inning of a 0-0 game, lifting NU to its eighth win of the year in its final at bat.

FOWLER A CLUTCH CO-CAPTAIN

Sophomore Mattie Fowler has been a clutch hitter through her first season-and-a-half as a Husker. Fowler, a co-captain, has especially come through in the clutch in late innings and against Big Ten teams. She owns eight game-winning RBIs in her career, including three in the seventh inning or later and five against Big Ten teams.

Nebraska has played six extra-inning games in Fowler's career, winning all six games. In 2012, NU won three games in the eighth inning. Fowler drove in the game-winning run in two of those victories and scored the game-winning run in the third. This season, Fowler has scored the game-winning run in one of the Huskers' three extra-inning victories, while also producing a game-winning, walk-off, two-run single in the bottom of the seventh inning against UNO. She also added a clutch game-tying, two-run homer in the sixth inning against Northwestern on March 22.

HUSKERS HOMERING AT NEAR-RECORD RATE

Despite a recent decline in home run production, Nebraska reached both the 25- and 30-home run plateaus faster than any other team in school history this season. This year's group hit 25 home runs in 21 games, eclipsing the previous mark set by the 1998 team, who hit its 25th home run in its 26th game. NU produced its 30th homer in its 26th game this year, better the previous mark of 29 games set in 2002 and 2011.

This year's team has good company among the other three teams to produce 25 home runs in fewer than 30 games. The 1998 Huskers posted the best winning percentage in school history and finished in a tie for fifth at the Women's College World Series. The 2011 Huskers nearly cracked the top 10 while posting the best non-conference record in school history, while the 2002 Huskers also finished in a tie for fifth at the WCWS in Nebraska's last appearance in the event.

Ten Huskers have homered already this season - tying the school record - with junior twins Taylor (10 homers) and Tatum (8) Edwards leading the way. The duo has combined for 18 home runs this year, after totaling 12 combined homers in 2012. Senior Brooke Thomason has homered five times, while freshmen Hailey Decker has homered four times.

The Huskers could also field a lineup this season where all nine players in the batting order have home run, a feat that would be a first in school history. The Huskers' normal starting batting order when Tatum Edwards pitches features eight players who have homered this season. The only player without a home run in that lineup is senior Gabby Banda, who homered four times in 2012.

From a career standpoint, this year's team features three of the top 10 home run hitters in school history in Thomason and the Edwards twins, all three of whom have hit at least 29 home runs. Taylor Edwards is third in school history with 33 career home runs, while Thomason is tied for fifth with 31 homers and Tatum sits in seventh place with 29 home runs. Nebraska has three players in the same lineup with 20 career home runs for only the third time in school history (also in 1998 and 2012) and two players with 30 home runs for just the second time (1998). No Husker team has ever featured three players with 30 career home runs.

REVELLE BECOMES NEBRASKA'S ALL-TIME COACHING WINS LEADER

Nebraska's 10-5 victory at Oklahoma State in the second game of a March 3 doubleheader was a historic one, as it made Rhonda Revelle Nebraska's all-time wins leader across all sports. The victory was Revelle's 768th at Nebraska, as she passed former baseball coach John Sanders, who won 767 games from 1978 to 1997.

REVELLE IN 21ST SEASON AT NEBRASKA

Rhonda Revelle is in her 21st season at Nebraska. She is one of 22 active Division I coaches who have spent more than 20 seasons at their current school. Revelle owns a 786-416 record at NU and a career mark of 794-432. Revelle needs six wins to reach 800 in her career.

THOMASON SETS GRAND SLAM RECORD

Senior Brooke Thomason hit her third career grand slam against Utah State on March 16 giving Nebraska the necessary runs for a 9-0, run-rule victory. Thomason is the first known player in school history to hit three career grand slams. All three of her bases-loaded blasts came in less than a calendar year.

Her first career grand slam was a dramatic shot that capped a two-homer game for the native of Overland Park, Kan. In Nebraska's first-ever Big Ten Conference game, Thomason belted a walk-off grand slam with two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning against Northwestern on March 23, 2012, to lift Nebraska to a 9-6 come-from-behind victory. Two weeks later, Thomason hit her second career grand slam, another walk-off shot that wrapped up an 11-0, six-inning victory over Illinois on April 6.

Thomason's most recent grand slam was the third by a Husker in 2013, as junior Taylor Edwards tied an NCAA record with two grand slams in one game against Illinois-Chicago on Feb. 9. Tatum Edwards hit NU's fourth grand slam this season against Minnesota on April 16, marking the program's most grand slams in a season since at least 2000.

TATUM EDWARDS HITS WELL WHEN PITCHING

Tatum Edwards has proven to be a dangerous hitter, as her ability with the bat has been the primary reason she has earned all-conference honors in each of her first two seasons. As Edwards has taken on an added pitching role this season, one might wonder if her offensive numbers may suffer as she pitches more innings. But that hasn't been the case for the junior thus far in her career. In fact, Edwards has put up better numbers when she's pitching than when she's the designated player or starts in the field.

Below is a look at Edwards' career batting statistics when she is also the starting pitcher, as well as a comparison of Edwards' statistics when she pitches and when she does not.

HUSKERS PRODUCE SECOND-HIGHEST CONFERENCE RUN TOTAL VS. NORTHWESTERN

Nebraska scored 14 runs in game two of a doubleheader with Northwestern on March 22 in a 14-1, five-inning victory. The 14 runs marked the second-highest run total the Huskers have ever scored in a conference game. It was one shy of matching the school record set on April 6, 1996 in a 15-11 Big 12 Conference victory over Kansas. The 14 runs scored against Northwestern were the most runs Nebraska has ever scored in a conference game of fewer than seven innings.

LOCKMAN TOSSES FIRST CAREER NO-HITTER

Freshman right-hander Emily Lockman joined an elite group of Husker pitchers by tossing her first career no-hitter, a six-inning effort against Utah State on Feb. 16. Lockman is the first Husker freshman to throw a no-hitter since Summer Tobias in 2003 and just the fifth ever. The first two freshmen to throw no-hitters ended their careers as All-Americans. Lori Sippel, currently in her 24th season as Nebraska's pitching coach, tossed a pair of no-hitters during her freshman season in 1985, while Jenny Voss threw a no-hitter as a freshman in 1997.

Lockman's no-hitter came in only her fourth career start and was the earliest no-hitter in school history. A native of Corona, Calif., Lockman is just the second Husker to throw a no-hitter in the month of February, joining All-American Peaches James who recorded her second career no-hitter as a senior on Feb. 20, 2004 against Houston. Lockman recorded her first career no-hitter faster than any other pitcher in school history, needing only her fourth start, bettering the previous record of seven starts by Tobias.

TAYLOR EDWARDS SETS SCHOOL RECORDS

Junior Taylor Edwards put together one of the most impressive individual performances in school history during a 13-4, five-inning victory over Illinois-Chicago on Feb. 9. Edwards had two grand slams and eight RBIs in the win, with both of her grand slams coming with two outs and on a 1-2 pitch. Her eight RBIs were a new school record, and her two grand slams were a first in school history and also tied school records for most grand slams in a season. Edwards is just the fourth player in NCAA history to hit two grand slams in the same game and the first since Holly Krzan of UAB did it against Nicholls State on Feb. 17, 2007.

HUSKER HITTERS LEAVING MARK IN NU RECORD BOOK

Senior Brooke Thomason and junior twins Tatum and Taylor Edwards have left their marks on the Husker record books in their careers. Thomason owns a .326 career batting average with 40 doubles, 31 home runs, 156 RBIs and a .550 slugging percentage. She enters this weekend third on Nebraska's all-time RBI chart, fourth in extra-base hits (71), tied for fifth in home runs, sixth in doubles, seventh in walks (86) and slugging percentage, eighth in total bases (327) and 14th in batting average.

Taylor Edwards, the only All-America catcher in school history, enters this weekend with the third-most home runs (33) in Husker history, the fourth-best slugging percentage (.633) and fourth-most RBIs (146) and walks (103) and the 13th-best batting average (.327). Using averages from her first two years, Edwards is on pace to finish her career with a school-record total in walks, the second-most RBIs and third-most home runs.

Tatum Edwards ranks sixth on Nebraska's all-time charts in slugging percentage (.567) and seventh in home runs (29). Tatum could crack the Huskers' all-time top 10 in RBIs before the end of her junior season.

HUSKERS KNOCK OFF NO. 1 FOR SECOND TIME IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Behind a seven-hit shutout from Emily Lockman and a solo home run from Tatum Edwards, Nebraska upset top-ranked Oklahoma, 1-0, in Norman on March 2. The win was Nebraska's second victory over a top-ranked opponent in school history, joining a 1-0 upset of No. 1 Florida on March 12, 2011. The win over the Gators came at a neutral site in Clearwater, Fla., as the win over Oklahoma marked the highest ranked opponent the Huskers have ever defeated on the road. The win also snapped the Sooners' 17-game season-opening win streak.

LOCKMAN TWO-TIME BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Emily Lockman earned her second Big Ten Freshman-of-the-Week honor on March 4. She was honored for the first time on Feb. 18. Lockman's first award came after she posted a 2-0 record with a pair of shutouts, 15 strikeouts and a 0.41 ERA at the Hillenbrand Invitational in Tucson, Ariz. Included in that performance was a six-inning no-hitter against Utah State that was the first no-hitter by a Husker freshman since 2003 and just the fourth overall. She added a career-high eight strikeouts against the Aggies.

Two weeks later, Lockman again posted a 2-0 record with road wins at Oklahoma and Oklahoma State. She threw a seven-hit shutout against the top-ranked Sooners, handing OU its first loss of the year.

TYSON NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Dawna Tyson was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on March 11. Tyson was honored for her outstanding performance in game two at Wichita State on March 9. Tyson reached base in all three of her plate appearances, finishing 2-for-2 with a hit-by-pitch. She homered for her third consecutive game and produced three RBIs.

TAYLOR EDWARDS NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior catcher Taylor Edwards was named the first Big Ten Player of the Week for the 2013 season on Feb. 11. Edwards went 10-for-18 on the weekend, posting a .556 batting average to go along with a .636 on-base percentage and 1.167 slugging percentage. She also homered three times, doubled twice and drove in 15 runs.

Against Illinois-Chicago, Edwards hit a pair of grand slams to become the first Husker to hit two grand slams in one game. She finished with eight RBIs in Nebraska's 13-4 victory, setting a school record for most RBIs in a game. Edwards enjoyed another big game in the tournament finale against New Mexico, finishing 3-for-3 with a double, a home run and five RBIs.

HUSKERS TIED BEST 10-GAME START IN SCHOOL HISTORY

With a 9-1 record through its first 10 games, Nebraska matched the best 10-game start in school history. This season marked the fourth time in Husker history that a team has won nine of its first 10 games, a feat that also happened in 1996, 2003, 2006 and 2011. Nebraska also posted 11 victories in the month of February, tying for the third-most February wins in school history. The Huskers' lone loss among its first 10 games and all four February losses overall came against top-20 opponents.

NEBRASKA WAS SUCCESSFUL IN SEASON'S OPENING MONTH

Nebraska finished 11-4 in February, allowing the Huskers to go from unranked and not receiving any votes to a No. 25 national ranking in the first USA Softball/ESPN.com poll in the month of March. The Huskers' 11 victories tied for the third-most in the month of February in school history.

Only the 2011 (14) and 2003 (12) Huskers won more games in February than this year's team. The 2002 squad also won 11 games in February. Each of those three teams went on to successful seasons and ended the year in the top 25. The 2011 Huskers notched the first victory over a No. 1 team in school history, the 2003 squad climbed to the highest ranking in school history (No. 3) and the 2002 Huskers were the last NU team to play in the WCWS.

PITCHING STAFF POSTED FANTASTIC FEBRUARY

Nebraska's pitching was tremendous in the season's opening month, especially considering the Huskers' three pitchers had combined for only 130.0 career innings entering this season. Nebraska boasted a 1.44 February ERA that ranked third in the Big Ten Conference.

The Huskers allowed one earned run or less in 11 of 15 games in February, including five shutouts and a sixth game where Nebraska did not allow an earned run, but did allow a run. During a stretch that began with Illinois-Chicago on Feb. 10 and ended with Purdue on Feb. 17, NU threw three shutouts and one no-hitter, while tossing 38.1 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run.

The pitching staff also fared well against some of the nation's best teams in February. Junior Tatum Edwards allowed just two earned runs in a pair of complete-game efforts against No. 19 Arizona and No. 1 Oklahoma, taking a no-hitter into the seventh inning against the Sooners. She also threw a shutout against No. 24 Florida State. Emily Lockman started against No. 8 California, firing a four-hitter and holding Cal to a season-low one run.

Nebraska finished February with a 1.44 ERA, just missing posting Nebraska's lowest ERA in the month since 2000. Since 2000, the lowest ERA a Husker team has ever posted after the opening month of the season was 1.43 in 2003, when Nebraska went 12-1 in February and climbed to as high as No. 3 in the national polls.

NEBRASKA'S GOLDEN GIRLS

Nebraska has enjoyed both recent and historical success recruiting talented players from California. The 2013 Husker roster features six natives of the Golden State. Included in that group are three players who earned California player-of-the-year honors during their high school careers. Junior Tatum Edwards was named the state's freshman of the year in 2007, while her twin sister Taylor was the California Junior of the Year in 2009, in addition to earning accolades as the nation's top junior from EA Sports. The third member of the Golden State player-of-the-year trio is freshman Emily Lockman, who was the California Gatorade Player of the Year in 2012.

Senior Courtney Breault, a 2012 second-team All-Big Ten and 2010 SEC All-Freshman Team selection (at Arkansas), and freshmen Danica Bishop and Dawna Tyson round out the California natives on NU's 2013 roster.

FOWLER AND THOMASON SELECTED AS HUSKER CO-CAPTAINS

Sophomore Mattie Fowler and senior Brooke Thomason will serve as Nebraska's co-captains for the 2013 season. Thomason is a four-year starter in right field who was a second-team All-Big 12 selection in 2010 and a second-team All-Big Ten pick in 2012. Fowler is one of the lead organizers for team functions. She was Nebraska's starting shortstop as a freshman in 2012, producing five doubles, five home runs and 27 RBIs, including driving in the winning run in five of Nebraska's 14 Big Ten Conference victories. Fowler has moved to first base this spring.

PROGRAM STABILITY

Nebraska softball is renowned for its tradition and one of the Huskers' richest traditions is stability. Nowhere is this highlighted more than looking at NU Head Coach Rhonda Revelle and Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel.

Revelle is in her 21st season at the helm of the Husker program in 2013, while Sippel is in her 24th year in Lincoln. Both coaches also played for Nebraska, with Revelle enjoying a three-year career and Sippel starring for four years. Counting their playing and coaching days, Revelle and Sippel have combined to be a part of 1,095 of Nebraska's 1,262 all-time victories (87 percent).

HUSKERS AT THE HEAD OF THE CLASS

Nebraska leads all softball programs nationally with 29 CoSIDA Academic All-America awards won by 21 players. The total also ranks second nationally among all female athletic programs, trailing only the Husker volleyball team's 37 selections. Overall, NU leads all institutions nationally with 302 academic All-Americans across all sports.

NU is one of only three softball programs with 20 or more selections. Since Rhonda Revelle became Nebraska's head coach in 1993, she has produced 13 academic All-Americans, the highest total of any coach during that span.

NEBRASKA 10TH-FASTEST PROGRAM TO POST 1,000 NCAA VICTORIES

Since softball became an official NCAA sport in 1982, Nebraska has posted 1,126 victories, winning its 1,000th game at Women's College World Series qualifier Missouri on May 2, 2009. Although no official statistic is kept for victories in the NCAA era, according to research from CBS College Sports, the Huskers were the 10th program to win 1,000 games as an NCAA sport. The nine other teams that reached 1,000 NCAA wins before Nebraska were UCLA, Arizona, Florida State, Cal State Fullerton, Louisiana-Lafayette, California, Texas A&M, Oklahoma and East Carolina.

OLYMPIC CONNECTIONS

Although softball is no longer an official Olympic sport, Nebraska had four players compete in a total of three Olympic Games, with Huskers competing in the 1996, 2004 and 2008 Olympic Games. Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel was the first Husker to play in the Olympics, as she pitched for Team Canada at the 1996 Atlanta Olympics.

Sippel then served as Team Canada head coach for the 2008 Beijing Olympics, when the Canadians finished fourth, their best finish ever. Former Huskers Sheena Lawrick and Robin Mackin were on that Canadian team, while Lawrick and Stephanie Skegas (Greece) competed in the 2004 Olympics.

From a Team USA standpoint, junior Taylor Edwards and freshman Hailey Decker both earned an invitation to try out for the Junior National Team in 2010.

HUSKER OFFENSE CONTINUES UPWARD TREND

Hitting coach Diane Miller has produced impressive results in her first five seasons at Nebraska, helping the Husker offense enjoy some of the most productive seasons in school history. Producing another outstanding season in 2013, Nebraska is enjoy a stretch of offensive success that is nearly unprecedented in school history.

- ▶ Nebraska has hit at least 30 home runs in each of Miller's first five seasons including 2013, marking the longest stretch of consecutive 30-homer seasons in school history.
- ▶ The Huskers have produced at least 55 doubles every full season under Miller, tying the longest consecutive stretch of seasons with at least 55 doubles in school history (also 1995-98 and 2000-03). NU owns 53 doubles this season.
- ▶ NU has totaled more than 200 RBIs in each of Miller's five seasons, including 2013. The current five-year stretch of consecutive 200-RBI seasons matchest the longest stretch in Husker history (2000 to 2004).
- ▶ Nebraska has scored at least 200 runs in all five seasons under Miller's instruction, including 2013. The only longer stretch in Husker history was seven seasons from 2000 to 2006.
- ▶ In less than five full seasons, Miller has helped Nebraska set school records for walks, on-base percentage and slugging percentage, while also posting the second-best marks in Husker history for on-base percentage and home runs.

Below is a compilation of statistics from the 2005 to 2008 seasons - the four years prior to Miller's arrival - and the 2009 to 2012 seasons - Miller's first four years in Lincoln. Nebraska is batting .020 better, slugging .071 higher and reaching base nearly four percent more often during Miller's tenure than during the same time frame prior to her arrival. The Huskers are also averaging 1.0 run more per game during that span, while averaging 62 more RBIs per season, 50 more walks, 20 more home runs and 19 more doubles.
