HUSKERS HEADING BACK TO WOMEN'S COLLEGE WORLD SERIES

The 14th-seeded Nebraska softball team makes its seventh appearance in the Women's College World Series this week, opening the tournament at 11 a.m. on Thursday against 11th-seeded Washington.

Nebraska, the lowest remaining seed of the eight teams who advanced to Oklahoma City, earned a spot in the field by winning two of three games against No. 3 Oregon in last week's NCAA Super Regional in Eugene, Ore. Playing in its first NCAA Super Regional in school history, the Huskers snapped the Ducks' nation-leading 24-game home winning streak on Saturday, then rebounded from a disappointing 11-inning game two loss on Sunday to earn a 4-2 victory over the Ducks in the rubber match of the series. With the win, Nebraska advanced to its seventh Women's College World Series in school history, its first since 2002 and its third under 21st-year Head Coach Rhonda Revelle.

The Huskers have relied on pitching, defense and timely hitting to advance this far. Nebraska boasts the nation's ninth-best ERA at 1.78, a mark that ranks fourth among the eight-team Women's College World Series field. Behind the pitching staff, the Husker defense ranks 35th nationally with a .970 fielding percentage, and Nebraska has turned a nation-leading 48 double plays, 26 more than any other team in Oklahoma City and as many as the next two highest teams combined (ASU and Washington).

From a hitting standpoint, Nebraska is batting .312 (24-for-77) with runners on base in the NCAA Tournament and .339 (19-for-56) with runners in scoring position. The Huskers have produced 18 of their 31 RBIs with two outs, while plating 20 of their 33 postseason runs with two outs (61 percent).

Junior right-hander Tatum Edwards, the 2013 Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, has been outstanding in the postseason. She has started five of Nebraska's six NCAA Tournament games, throwing a complete game each time, including one shutout. Edwards is 4-1 with 1.62 ERA in 39.0 postseason innings. Included in her four victories are two wins over No. 13 Stanford and one win over third-ranked Oregon. As good as Edwards was, it was freshman Emily Lockman who earned the series-clinching victory for NU. Lockman allowed two first-inning runs and nothing the rest of the way in a complete-game victory at No. 3 Oregon in game three of the super regional in her postseason debut.

Offensively, senior Brooke Thomason has collected seven hits, including one double and two homers, and driven in 10 runs in six NCAA Tournament games. Freshman Alicia Armstrong leads NU with a .474 average in the postseason (9-for-19), while senior Gabby Banda owns an 11-game hitting streak.

NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS



Tatum Edwards, Jr., RHP/OF

The Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and unanimous first-team All-Big Ten selection, Edwards is 30-9 with a 1.81 ERA. Ranked 10th nationally in shutouts and wins, Edwards is 4-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 39.0 IP in the NCAA Tournament. A three-time all-conference performer, Edwards has also slugged 11 doubles and 11 home runs at the plate.



Brooke Thomason, Sr., RF

A second-team all-region and All-Big Ten pick, Thomason is batting .335 with nine homers and 12 doubles. Her 56 RBIs rank 39th nationally and are good for fifth in NU history. She ranks second in school history and 16th among all active players with 175 career RBIs. Thomason is hitting .350 with two homers and 10 RBIs in the postseason.

Nebraska has won 55 games in the NCAA Tournament, owning an all-time record of 55-43. The Huskers' 55 victories rank 13th in NCAA Division I history.

SCOUTING THE WASHINGTON HUSKIES (43-15)

Nebraska takes on a Pac-12 opponent for the sixth consecutive game in its Women's College World Series opener, facing off against No. 11 seed Washington. The Huskies are 43-15 this season and have breezed through the opening two rounds of the NCAA Tournament. Washington is 5-0 in the postseason, outscoring its opponents 15-2, including a two-game sweep at No. 6 Missouri in the NCAA Super Regional. Nebraska and Washington share 11 common opponents this season in Arizona, Cal, Florida State, Illinois, Michigan, Nebraska-Omaha, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Oregon, Penn State and Stanford. The Huskers posted a 15-8 record against that group, while the Huskies went 12-7.

Offensively, Washington is hitting .309 as a team while averaging 5.9 runs per game. The Huskies rank among the top 30 offenses nationally in scoring (23rd), average (24th) and slugging percentage (28th). Washington has scored two runs or less in four of its five NCAA Tournament games, averaging 3.0 runs per game in the postseason.

Individually, Victoria Hayward is one of seven Washington regulars hitting above .300. She leads the team with a .380 average, five triples and 21 stolen bases, while adding six doubles, five homers and 21 RBIs. Kaitlin Inglesby is hitting .361 with eight doubles and team-high totals of 11 homers and 60 RBIs, ranking 31st nationally in RBIs. Hooch Fagaly is batting .348 with 10 homers, 47 RBIs and a team-high 41 walks. Kylee Lahners is hitting .306 with nine homers and 42 RBIs, while Kelli Suguro boasts a .304 average. Inglesby, Hayward and Fagaly were each first-team all-region and All-Pac-12 selections.

Defensively, Washington is allowing an average of 2.7 runs per game, but the Huskies have allowed just two runs in their five NCAA Tournament games (0.4 runs per game). UW boasts the nation's second-best fielding percentage at .981. The staff owns a 2.56 ERA that ranks 58th nationally, the lowest ranking of any team in the Women's College World Series field and the only team ERA that doesn't rank among the top 40 nationally.

Inglesby and Bryana Walker have split the majority of the innings for Washington this season. Inglesby is 22-7 with a 1.87 ERA in 168.1 innings. She has thrown 12 complete games among her 18 starts, tossing four shutouts while striking out 130 and limiting opposing hitters to a .228 average. Walker is 19-7 on the year with a 2.81 ERA in a team-high 172.0 innings. She has started a team-high 33 games and struck out 196 batters. Opponents are hitting just .217 against her, but have homered 25 times. Kasey Stancheck (2-1, 3.92 ERA in 30.1 IP) and Jocelyn Cater (0-0, 9.00 ERA in 4.2 IP) round out the Washington staff.

HUSKER HISTORY WITH WASHINGTON

Washington leads the all-time series with Nebraska 8-3, including a 2-0 advantage in the NCAA Tournament and a 1-0 record at the Women's College World Series. The Huskies have won four straight in the series and eight of the last nine overall. Each of the 11 all-time meetings have come with Head Coach Rhonda Revelle in the Husker dugout, and she is 1-4 against Washington Head Coach Heather Tarr. Washington eliminated the Huskers from the 1998 Women's College World Series with a 3-1 victory, and the Huskies, led by Tarr in her first season, handed Nebraska a 7-6 loss in the 2005 NCAA Lincoln Regional.

The teams last met twice during the opening month of the 2012 season. Washington shut out the Huskers, 4-0, in the season opener for both teams, before earning a 6-3 win two weeks later. Kaitlin Inglesby earned both victories, tossing a two-hit shutout in the first win and allowing just one earned run in game two. She posted a 0.50 ERA in the two games, allowing only six hits while striking out 11 in 13.0 innings. Inglesby also went 2-for-5 at the plate with a home run and two RBIs. Taylor Smith went 3-for-6 in the two games with three RBIs.

For Nebraska, Ashley Hagemann took the loss in both games. The Huskers hit just .122 against Inglesby, led by a 2-for-5 performance from Gabby Banda that included a home run. Taylor Edwards and Courtney Breault each finished 1-for-4 in the two games, while the rest of Nebraska's current roster combined to go 0-for-20.

HUSKER HISTORY AT THE WOMEN'S COLLEGE WORLD SERIES

Nebraska is making its seventh official trip to the Women's College World Series, not including its 1985 runner-up finish which was vacated by the NCAA Committee on Infractions. The Huskers have won at least one game in each of their first six trips to the WCWS, finishing no worse than a tie for fifth place each time. Nebraska is 8-12 (.400) all-time in the Women's College World Series, including a 3-3 record in its first game of the tournament.

HUSKERS SET SCHOOL RECORD FOR MOST WALKS IN A SEASON

Nebraska drew three walks last weekend against Oregon in the NCAA Super Regional, increasing its season total to 206. The Huskers have set a school record for most walks in a season for the second consecutive year, after walking 204 times in 2012. Four Huskers have drawn at least 20 walks this season, led by senior Gabby Banda's school-record-tying 40 walks.

BANDA RIDING CAREER-LONG 11-GAME HIT STREAK

Senior Gabby Banda has hit safely in 11 consecutive games, the longest hitting streak of her career and tied with freshman Alicia Armstrong for the longest hitting streak by a Husker this season. Banda is hitting .394 during the streak (13-for-33) with seven runs, four RBIs and four walks. During the hitting streak, Banda has raised her season batting average 28 points, from .256 before the streak to its current mark of .284.

TATUM EDWARDS POSTS 30 WINS

Junior right-hander Tatum Edwards earned a complete-game victory at No. 3 Oregon last Saturday, snapping the Ducks' nation-leading 24-game home winning streak and handing Oregon its first home loss of the season. The win was her 30th of the season, as she became only the fourth Husker to post a 30-win season. She joined All-Americans Jenny Voss (40 wins in 1998) and Peaches James (37 wins in 2004), along with Ashley Hagemann (31 wins in 2011) as members of Nebraska's 30-win club. With a 30-9 record, Edwards ranks 10th nationally in wins this season. She has nearly doubled her career victory total entering the year, as she won 16 games her first two seasons combined. Edwards is one win away from tying Hagemann for the most wins ever by a Husker junior.

HUSKERS POST HIGHEST POSTSEASON RUN TOTAL IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Nebraska has scored 33 runs through its first six games of the 2013 NCAA Tournament, an average of 5.5 runs per game. The 33 runs the Huskers have scored this postseason are already the highest total any Nebraska team has ever produced in a single NCAA Tournament. The previous record had been 28 runs from the 2000 Huskers, who went 3-2 in the NCAA Tournament.

HIGH-SCORING HUSKERS

Fueled by 33 runs in its six NCAA Tournament games, Nebraska has scored 307 runs this season, becoming only the fourth team in school history to score 300 runs in a season. Nebraska has scored 300 runs in a season for the first time since 2000, and that season it took NU 73 games to score 312 runs. This year's team has nearly matched that output, scoring 307 runs in only 59 games. The Husker offense, under the direction of fifth-year hitting coach Diane Miller, has posted three of the six highest run totals in school history the past three seasons, an especially impressive feat considering the NCAA's recent policy allowing teams to play a maximum of 56 regular-season games.

RECAPPING NEBRASKA'S SUPER REGIONAL TITLE

Nebraska earned a spot in Oklahoma City this weekend by winning two of three games at No. 3 Oregon last weekend, handing the Ducks their only two home losses of the season. Nebraska won game won 5-2 behind a complete-game effort from junior Tatum Edwards, who allowed only one earned run, and a fifth-inning grand slam from senior Brooke Thomason. In game two, Nebraska was three outs away from a victory before Oregon rallied to tie the game in the seventh en route to a 4-3 win in 11 innings. In game three, freshman Emily Lockman allowed only two runs in a complete-game effort, and classmate Alicia Armstrong drove in the game-winning run with an RBI infield single in the top of the third inning.

A LOOK AT THE PROBABLE LINEUP

1

TATUM EDWARDS, P -OR- LF (42 STARTS, .292, 11 2B, 11 HR, 26 RBIs, 34 STARTS, 30-9, 1.81 ERA, 214 Ks, 240.0 IP)
Edwards plays a key dual role for NU this spring. In the circle, the 2013 Big Ten Pitcher of the Year ranks 10th nationally in shutouts (10) and wins (30). At the plate, she is a three-time all-conference honoree who ranks fifth in NU history with 32 career homers and sixth with a .572 career slugging percentage.

2

GABBY BANDA, 3B (59 STARTS, .284, 5 2B, 0 HR, 20 RBIs)
Banda is in her third season as NU's starter at third and fourth season as an infield starter. A third-team All-Big Ten selection in 2012, Banda led NU with a career-high .352 average and 14 doubles. A 2013 Big Ten All-Defensive Team selection, Banda has started 224 games in her career, including 194 straight.

3

TAYLOR EDWARDS, C (59 STARTS, .322, 14 2B, 12 HR, 52 RBIs)
The only All-America catcher in school history, Edwards set an NU freshman record with 18 homers and earned third-team All-America honors in 2011. In 2012, she walked an NU-record 40 times. This year she has produced an NU junior-record 52 RBIs, including a school-record two grand slams and 8 RBIs vs. UIC.

4

BROOKE THOMASON, RF (59 STARTS, .335, 12 2B, 9 HR, 56 RBIs)
An All-Big 12 selection in 2010 and All-Big Ten pick in 2012 and 2013, Thomason ranks second in NU history with 175 RBIs and third with 78 extra-base hits and 35 homers. She is the first player in school history to produce four 30-RBI seasons and is just the fifth Husker with 30 career doubles and 30 homers.

5

COURTNEY BREAUULT, DP (24 STARTS, .258, 2 2B, 5 HR, 24 RBIs)
Breault battled through injuries to become a second-team All-Big Ten selection in 2012, an accomplishment she repeated in 2013. She has earned 24 starts as the DP this year, including 21 straight, when she has hit four homers and driven in 21. Thirteen of her 23 hits and 12 of her 24 RBIs came during Big Ten play.

6

HAILEY DECKER, 2B (59 STARTS, .244, 12 2B, 5 HR, 27 RBIs)
Decker has started all 59 games at second and became the third player in school history to homer in her first career at bat. Twice named the Oregon Player of the Year, Decker posted a .599 career prep average. Her father Steve is the coordinator of minor league hitting instruction for the San Francisco Giants.

7

ALICIA ARMSTRONG, SS (59 STARTS, .347, 9 2B, 4 HR, 18 RBIs)
Armstrong earned second-team All-Big Ten honors this spring and a spot on the Big Ten All-Defensive squad. A three-sport all-state selection as a high school senior, Armstrong is focusing on softball for the first time after setting Nebraska state records with a .690 average as a senior and a .514 career mark.

8

MATTIE FOWLER, 1B (51 STARTS, .245, 3 2B, 4 HR, 21 RBIs)
Fowler started every game as a freshman, including 49 starts at shortstop. She tore her ACL last summer and has moved to first base. She was limited early, but has started 50 games at first, including 42 straight. She owns 10 game-winning RBIs in her career, including three in the seventh inning or later.

JORDAN BETTIOL, CF (56 STARTS, .292, 3 2B, 0 HR, 7 RBIs)
Bettiol has started 41 games in left field and 15 in center after making 18 outfield starts and 20 total starts as a freshman. A first-team All-American as a high school senior, Bettiol hit .417 (12-for-30) with 12 runs scored and a .526 on-base percentage in league play to earn second-team All-Big Ten accolades.

10

EMILY LOCKMAN, P (25 STARTS, 15-5, 1.74 ERA, 104 Ks, 149.0 IP)
The 2012 California Gatorade Player of the Year and first-team All-American, Lockman went 74-19 in her prep career with a 0.89 ERA. This spring, the second-team All-Big Ten selection has thrown four shutouts, including the first no-hitter by an NU freshman since 2003 and a shutout of No. 1 Oklahoma.

OR

KIKI STOKES, LF (56 STARTS, .264, 0 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBIs)
One of the fastest players in school history, Stokes was a three-time NFCA High School All-American and two-time, first-team honoree who set Olathe East records with a .605 career batting average, 181 hits, 163 runs scored and 87 stolen bases. She hit an inside-the-park homer at Wichita State.

P

DANICA BISHOP (0 STARTS, 0-0, 1.75 ERA, 5 Ks, 8.0 IP)
A hard worker making great strides in her pitching development, Bishop serves as Nebraska's No. 3 pitcher this spring. She was an all-county all-star as a senior for Woodbridge High School.

IF

KYLEE MUIR (9 STARTS, .256, 3 2B, 1 HR, 6 RBIs)
After backing up all-conference players at both designated player and first base the past two seasons, Muir has seen more playing time this year, exceeding her career totals in at bats, hits, runs and RBIs.

C

SAMMI NOLAND (0 STARTS, .000, 0 2B, 0 HR, 0 RBIs)
Noland backs up All-American Taylor Edwards behind the plate, while also earning time as both a pinch-hitter and pinch runner. She was a two-time All-Southern Arizona selection in high school.

OF

MEGAN SOUTHWORTH (2 STARTS, .000, 0 2B, 0 HR, 0 RBIs)
Southworth is competing for playing time in left field, a position where she started a team-high 28 games in 2011. Southworth also owns more pinch hits (8) than the rest of the NU roster combined (6).

IF

DAWNA TYSON (29 STARTS, .267, 0 2B, 3 HR, 16 RBIs)
Tyson has split time at first base and at DP earning 29 total starts. A two-time All-CIF selection, Tyson has started 23 of the last 41 games, producing 20 hits, three homers and 14 RBIs in that stretch.

QUICK HITTERS

The information below provides a quick glimpse of a few brief notes heading into the WCWS:

- ▶ NU is making its seventh NCAA Women's College World Series appearance in school history and first since 2002.
- ▶ The Huskers won their first NCAA Regional title since 2002 this year and their first NCAA Super Regional title ever.
- ▶ Nebraska's 45 wins this season are its most since 2004 (45) and tie for the fifth-most victories in school history.
- ▶ NU's non-conference schedule was the toughest in the nation according to the NCAA RPI.
- ▶ NU's roster features seven freshmen, tying for the most freshmen in Coach Revelle's 21 seasons (also 2008).
- ▶ NU's starting lineup has featured at least three freshmen in every game, including 16 games with five freshmen.
- ▶ The freshmen have combined for 36 extra-base hits, the eighth-highest total by a freshman class in NU history.
- ▶ Nebraska has allowed one run or less in 29 of its 59 games this season, including 16 shutouts.
- ▶ Gabby Banda needs one walk to break a four-way tie and own the school record outright for walks in a season (41).
- ▶ Courtney Breault enters the Women's College World Series with 99 career RBIs.
- ▶ Tatum Edwards needs one more win to tie for the most victories ever by a Husker junior (31).
- ▶ The Edwards twins have homered in the same game nine times in their careers, including twice in 2013.
- ▶ Head Coach Rhonda Revelle has won 799 games at Nebraska, one shy of 800.
- ▶ The Big Ten has two teams competing in the WCWS (Nebraska and Michigan) for the first time since 2001.
- ▶ Nebraska has played five consecutive games against Pac-12 teams in the NCAA Tournament, going 4-1.
- ▶ The Huskers had lost seven straight NCAA Tournament games to Pac-12 teams and been just 7-19 all-time against the league in the postseason before its success in the 2013 NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ The Big Ten as a conference is 6-2 against the Pac-12 in the 2013 NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ One more home run from Brooke Thomason would give Nebraska three players with double-digit home runs in the same season for the first time in school history. It would also give NU three players with 10 doubles and 10 homers in the same season for the first time in school history.

BANDA TIES NEBRASKA SEASON WALK RECORD

Senior Gabby Banda walked three times in three games in the NCAA Lincoln Regional two weeks ago. Her walk against No. 13 Stanford in the regional final was her 40th of the season, tying Nebraska's season walk record. She is the fourth Husker to draw 40 walks in a season, including Taylor Edwards last season. Banda will own the record outright with one more walk. Batting in front of a pair of 50-RBI producers, Banda has excelled at reaching base for the middle of the Husker lineup. In addition to her 40 walks - which rank fourth in the Big Ten and tied for 29th nationally - Banda has been hit by eight pitches, helping her post a .448 on-base percentage in front of two of the nation's top 80 RBI producers this spring.

SWEET 16 IN 2013 FOR NEBRASKA WOMEN'S ATHLETICS

By advancing to the Women's College World Series, Nebraska is one of only eight teams remaining in the 2013 NCAA Softball Tournament. The softball team has joined the Husker volleyball (Elite Eight) and women's basketball (Sweet 16) squads in advancing to the round of 16 in their respective NCAA Tournaments. Nebraska and Kentucky were the only schools in the country to advance to the round of 16 in women's volleyball, women's basketball and softball in the 2012-13 school year.

Overall, seven of Nebraska's 12 female sports finished in the top 16 in their respective NCAA Tournament, capped by the Husker bowling team's fourth NCAA title. The Nebraska women's tennis team made the first NCAA Round of 16 appearance in school history, while women's gymnastics and women's rifle rounded out to the group of top-16 finishers.

OFFENSIVE ADJUSTMENTS PAY OFF LATE IN GAME

Nebraska's offense has excelled at making adjustments the second, third and fourth time through the order. Those adjustments have helped the Huskers win 11 games in their final at bat, as the offensive production has increased later in the game. Overall, 46 percent of Nebraska's runs this season have scored in the fifth inning or later. Nebraska has outscored its opponents 141-58 from the fifth inning on this season. That has held true in the NCAA Tournament, when the Huskers have scored 24 of their 33 runs in the fifth inning or later, outscoring their opponents 24-8.

Statistically, Nebraska is hitting .277 as a team with a .413 slugging percentage over the first four frames combined. But from the fifth inning on, the Huskers are hitting .304 with a .493 slugging percentage. Nebraska's highest batting average in any of the first four innings is a .289 mark in the first. But the Huskers are hitting .306 in the fifth inning, .348 in the sixth, .308 in the eighth inning, .384 in the ninth and .300 in the 10th and later.

NEBRASKA LEADS NATION IN TURNING DOUBLE PLAYS

Nebraska has recorded a nation-leading 48 double plays this season. Nebraska's 48 double plays are a school record, and the Huskers are one of only four teams nationally to turn even 30 double plays this spring. Of the 48 double plays, 29 have been ground ball double plays and 19 have been line-drive or pop-up double plays.

Twice this season, the Huskers have put together a streak of eight consecutive games turning at least one double play. Nebraska had its most recent streak snapped in the first game of the NCAA Tournament, but the Huskers have still turned 18 double plays in their last 14 games, including six in their six NCAA Tournament games. Nebraska has also posted 11 games where the Huskers have turned at least two double plays, including tying the school record with three double plays against No. 9 Michigan on April 28.

THREE HUSKERS EARN NFCA ALL-MIDWEST REGION ACCOLADES

Three Huskers earned All-Midwest region honors from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association this spring. Junior Tatum Edwards was a first-team pitcher/utility selection, while freshman right-hander Emily Lockman was a first-team pitcher. Senior Brooke Thomason was a second-team outfielder.

Both of Nebraska's primary pitchers earned first-team all-region accolades, the first award for both Edwards and Lockman. The recognition was not a surprise, as the Huskers rank 10th nationally in ERA (1.79) and 17th nationally in winning percentage (.768). Thomason earned a spot on the second team for the second time in her career and for the first time since her freshman season in 2010. Overall, Nebraska's two first-team selections and three total honorees tied for the most of any school in the Midwest region.

Lockman was one of only two freshmen on the All-Midwest Region first team, and she was one of only two freshmen pitchers nationally chosen as a first-team all-region selection. Nebraska's three all-region selections are now eligible for NFCA All-America honors. The 2013 All-America first-, second- and third-teams will be announced on Wednesday.

TATUM EDWARDS NAMED BIG TEN PITCHER OF THE YEAR

Junior Tatum Edwards was selected as the 2013 Big Ten Pitcher of the Year in a vote of the league's 12 head coaches. Edwards is the first Husker to earn a player-of-the-year award since All-American Peaches James was named the Big 12 Player of the Year in 2004. Edwards was 11-4 with a league-low 1.98 ERA in Big Ten Conference play, helping Nebraska to a second-place conference finish.

A native of Murrieta, Calif., Edwards was the only Big Ten pitcher to post an ERA below 2.25 in conference play. She also threw a league-high 95.1 innings during the conference season, while posting the lowest opponent batting average (.177) and recording the second-most wins and strikeouts (93) of any Big Ten pitcher.

A unanimous first-team All-Big Ten selection, Edwards has been an all-conference honoree each of her first three seasons. She was a second-team All-Big 12 selection in 2011 and a third-team All-Big Ten pick in 2012.

SEVEN HUSKERS EARN ALL-BIG TEN RECOGNITION

Led by junior Tatum Edwards, the 2013 Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, Nebraska had seven players earn first- or second-team All-Big Ten recognition this spring. Tatum Edwards was also a first-team all-conference honoree in addition to being named the league's pitcher of the year. Her twin sister Taylor was Nebraska's only other first-team selection. Overall, NU's seven selections tied with Michigan for the most of any Big Ten team.

Tatum went 11-4 with a 1.98 ERA in conference play, leading the Big Ten in innings (95.1) and opponent batting average (.177), while ranking second in wins and strikeouts (93). Taylor caught all of Tatum's games and was one of three catchers selected to the 18-player first team. Taylor batted .373 in conference play, producing nine doubles, five home runs and 22 RBIs, while slugging .780 and reaching base at a .553 clip. Both Edwards sisters earned first-team all-conference recognition for the first time in their careers, while Tatum was an all-conference selection for the third time in her career and Taylor earned her second all-conference accolade. Tatum and Taylor were both unanimous selections, two of only five players to be unanimous selections.

Seniors Courtney Breault and Brooke Thomason, sophomore Jordan Bettiol and freshmen Alicia Armstrong and Emily Lockman each earned second-team honors. Breault and Thomason were second-team All-Big Ten selections for the second straight year, while Thomason picked up the third all-conference accolade of her career. Bettiol, Armstrong and Lockman each earned the first all-conference award of their careers.

Breault batted .310 in conference play, producing three home runs and 12 RBIs, while slugging .548. Thomason ranked second on the team with 16 RBIs in Big Ten action, while drawing 13 walks and producing three doubles and one home run. Bettiol broke out during conference play, emerging over the second-half of the league schedule to lead Nebraska with a .400 batting average. She also added two stolen bases while posting a .526 on-base percentage. Armstrong hit .380 during the conference slate, producing five extra-base hits and nine RBIs. In the circle, Lockman was 5-2 in Big Ten play with a 2.57 ERA in 51.2 innings. She posted the fourth-lowest ERA of any Big Ten pitcher during the conference season.

THREE HUSKERS NAMED TO BIG TEN ALL-DEFENSIVE TEAM

Senior Gabby Banda, junior Taylor Edwards and freshman Alicia Armstrong were each honored as the best fielder at their position by earning a spot on the Big Ten All-Defensive team. Banda was the team's third baseman, while Edwards was the catcher and Armstrong was the shortstop.

Banda committed only two errors in 79 chances at third base during Big Ten play, posting a .975 fielding percentage. Armstrong committed just three errors at shortstop, posting a .964 fielding percentage that led all Big Ten shortstops. Behind the plate, Edwards committed only one error while throwing out more base stealers in conference play than any other Big Ten catcher.

Armstrong and Edwards were two of five players to earn All-Big Ten and Big Ten All-Defensive team honors.

LOCKMAN, TATUM EDWARDS EARN SPOTS ON BIG TEN ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Freshman Emily Lockman and junior Tatum Edwards each earned a spot on the 12-player Big Ten All-Tournament team. Lockman was honored after throwing a three-hitter and allowing only one run in a semifinal loss to Minnesota. Edwards was honored after earning a complete-game victory over Purdue in the quarterfinals, and producing two hits at the plate, including one double.

TATUM EDWARDS LED BIG TEN IN ERA IN LEAGUE GAMES

Junior Tatum Edwards posted a conference-low 1.98 ERA while throwing a league-high 95.1 innings in Big Ten play this season. She was the only Big Ten pitcher to post an ERA below 2.00 during the conference slate, finishing well ahead of Wisconsin's Cassandra Darrah, who ranked second with a 2.25 ERA.

In the 21 seasons Rhonda Revelle has been head coach of the Huskers dating back to 1993, Edwards is just the second Nebraska pitcher to lead the conference in ERA in league play. The only other Husker to accomplish that feat was Peaches James as a freshman in 2001. James went on to become an All-American for the Huskers.

HUSKERS RECORD 40-WIN SEASON

Nebraska owns 45 victories this season, posting its 11th 40-win season in school history and first since winning 41 games in 2011. Nebraska has won 40 games for only the second time in the past seven seasons. The Huskers' 45 wins are the program's most since 2004 (45) and rank in a tie for fifth in school history. One win at the Women's College World Series would give Nebraska its most victories since winning 50 games in 2002.

50/50

Senior Brooke Thomason leads Nebraska with 56 RBIs this season, while junior Taylor Edwards ranks second with 52 RBIs. Edwards has produced the most RBIs ever by a Husker junior, while she is seventh on Nebraska's season RBI chart. Thomason is tied for fourth on the Husker season RBI chart, and she needs one RBI to tie All-American Ali Viola's record for the most RBIs by a Husker senior.

Together, Edwards and Thomason have produced only the seventh and eighth 50-RBI seasons in school history. They have joined the 1996 tandem of Viola and Jenny Smith as the only Husker teammates to each produce 50 RBIs in the same season. Edwards is only the second Husker to produce two 50-RBI seasons in a career, as she drove in 67 runs as a freshman in 2011.

TAYLOR EDWARDS BREAKS NU JUNIOR-CLASS RBI RECORD

Taylor Edwards owns 52 RBIs this season, the most ever by a Husker junior, eclipsing the mark set last season by Brooke Thomason (48). Edwards, who ranks fourth in school history with 157 career RBIs, has joined three-time All-American Ali Viola as the only Huskers to produce multiple 50-RBI seasons in a career. Previously, Edwards drove in 67 runs as a freshman in 2011.

Overall, Edwards ranks 28th nationally among all active Division I players with her 157 career RBIs, a total that ranks fourth among all non-seniors.

TWIN SLUGGERS

Junior twins Tatum and Taylor Edwards have combined to hit 23 home runs this season, with Taylor homering 12 times and Tatum adding 11 home runs. This year marks only the seventh time in school history that two Huskers have hit double-digit home runs in the same season, and the second time the Edwards twins have accomplished the feat after Taylor homered 18 times as a freshman in 2011 and Tatum added 14 home runs. Overall, the Edwards twins have produced the fifth-highest two-player home run total in school history.

HUSKER HOME RUN HITTERS

Senior Brooke Thomason and junior twins Tatum and Taylor Edwards have each eclipsed 30 career home runs this spring. Only six players in school history have slugged 30 career home runs, and three of them bat in this year's lineup. Taylor and Thomason rank third in school history with 35 home runs each, while Tatum ranks fifth with 32 home runs. This year marks the only time in school history that a Husker lineup has featured three players with 30-or-more career home runs.

NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS

53 **NCAA TOURNAMENT VICTORIES**
Nebraska has won 55 games in its 21 NCAA Tournament appearances while posting an overall record of 55-43 (.561 winning percentage). The Huskers' 55 wins rank 13th in NCAA history.

29 **ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS**
A total of 21 Huskers have combined to earn 29 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors. That total is the most of any softball program in the country and ranks second among all female athletic programs nationally behind the Nebraska volleyball team (37).

21 **NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES**
In the 32 years softball has been an NCAA sport, the Huskers have made 21 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 13 straight from 1995 to 2007. Nebraska's 21 postseason appearances rank 10th in NCAA history.

21 **ALL-AMERICANS**
Nebraska has produced 21 All-Americans in school history, including six first-team All-Americans, four two-time honorees and a pair of three-time All-Americans.

18 **CONFERENCE TITLES**
Nebraska has won 18 conference titles in its 37 seasons as a varsity sport. The Huskers won 12 Big Eight titles and six Big 12 crowns and are looking for their first Big Ten title.

15 **ALL-AMERICANS UNDER REVELLE**
In her first 20 years as Nebraska's head coach, Rhonda Revelle has guided 10 players to a total of 15 All-America honors.

13 **TOP-25 NATIONAL FINISHES**
Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 13 of the 18 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

13 **REVELLE'S ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS**
Rhonda Revelle has produced 13 Academic All-Americans in her 21 seasons as Nebraska's coach. Over that time frame, Revelle has coached more academic All-Americans than any other coach in the country.

7 **WOMEN'S COLLEGE WORLD SERIES**
Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 10th in NCAA history.

6 **TOP 10 ATTENDANCE SEASONS**
In the 12 years the Huskers have called Bowlin Stadium home, Nebraska has ranked in the top 10 nationally in average attendance six times.

HUSKER OFFENSE THREATENING SCHOOL RECORDS

Nebraska is on pace to challenge several offensive school records this season. Entering the NCAA Super Regional, Nebraska owns the third-best on-base percentage in school history with a mark of .383, along with the third-best slugging percentage (.444). Nebraska's .288 batting average currently ranks fifth in school history and would mark the third straight season the Husker offense has posted a top-five team batting average.

Despite playing only 59 games and competing against some years where Nebraska played as many as 73 games, this year's offense has also put up impressive cumulative totals that rank among the best in school history. NU's 206 walks are a school record, breaking the record for the second straight season. Nebraska's 56 home runs rank third in school history, as do its 282 RBIs. The Huskers also own top-five marks in school history in extra-base hits (3rd - 131), hit-by-pitches (t-4th - 42) and doubles (t-4th - 74).

HIT ME WITH YOUR BEST SHOT

Junior Taylor Edwards has been hit by 14 pitches this season, a new school record. The previous record had been 11 hit-by-pitches shared by Julie Brechtel and Ashley Guile in 2010. In addition to her Nebraska season record, Edwards owns the Husker single-game record after being hit by three pitches on two occasions this season. Overall, Edwards has been plunked 24 times in her career, good for third on Nebraska's all-time chart.

THOMASON & TAYLOR EDWARDS RANK AMONG NATION'S ACTIVE CAREER LEADERS

Senior Brooke Thomason and junior Taylor Edwards have put up outstanding offensive statistics in their careers that rank among the top 10 in school history in seven and six categories, respectively. The duo have not only posted totals among the best in NU history, but they have also produced statistics that rank highly among all active Division I softball players.

Of the approximately 5,000 current Division I softball players, Thomason has produced statistics that rank among the top one percent (50 players) of all players in three categories. Entering the WCWS, she ranked 16th among all active players with 175 RBIs, 28th with 43 doubles and 44th with 93 walks.

Edwards has also produced numbers that rank among the top one percent of all current college softball players in three categories, an impressive feat considering her junior status. Entering the WCWS, Edwards ranked 22nd among all active players with 109 career walks, 28th with 157 RBIs and 49th with 35 home runs. Edwards ranked fourth among all current players not in their senior season in RBIs and walks and ninth in home runs.

TAYLOR EDWARDS SETS THREE-YEAR WALK RECORD

Junior Taylor Edwards has walked 32 times this season, pushing her career total to 109 walks, good for fourth in school history and 17 more than three-time All-American Jennifer Lizama's previous record-total of 92 walks through a Husker's first three seasons. Edwards is only 16 walks from passing Lizama's career record of 124 walks.

With 32 walks this season, Edwards has become the first player in school history to draw at least 30 walks in three different seasons. She walked 37 times in 2011 and tied the school record with 40 walks in 2012.

Senior Brooke Thomason and junior Taylor Edwards each eclipsed 30 career doubles and 30 career home runs this spring, becoming the fourth and fifth members, respectively, of Nebraska's 30-30 club. Thomason became the fourth player in school history to produce 30 career doubles and 30 career home runs with a home run against Oregon on Feb. 23. Taylor Edwards became the fifth member of the club when she slugged her 30th career double and 33rd career home run in game one of a doubleheader against Minnesota on April 16. Edwards and three-time All-American Ali Viola are the only players in school history to join the 30-30 club prior to their senior season. Taylor's twin sister Tatum enters the Women's College World Series with 28 career doubles and 32 career home runs.

HUSKERS BOAST TWO OF NATION'S BEST PITCHERS

Junior right-hander Tatum Edwards and freshman right-hander Emily Lockman have helped the Huskers rank ninth nationally in ERA (1.78), 10th in shutouts (16) and 12th in victories (45).

Edwards, the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, is 30-9 with a 1.81 ERA in 240.0 innings. She ranks 10th nationally in shutouts and wins, while establishing career highs in nearly every category after entering this year with a 16-5 record and a 2.69 ERA in 130.0 career innings.

Edwards is 6-6 against ranked teams this season, posting victories over No. 3 Oregon, No. 9 Michigan (twice), No. 13 Stanford (twice) and No. 23 Florida State. She shut out the Seminoles and did not allow an earned run in a 1-0 loss at No. 16 Arizona. Edwards also allowed just one run in her first victory over Michigan and Stanford and just one earned run against Oregon last Saturday.

Lockman, a second-team All-Big Ten pick, is 15-5 with a 1.74 ERA in 149.0 innings. She leads the Big Ten in fewest runs allowed and is second in ERA. She tossed the first no-hitter by a Husker freshman since 2003 in her fourth career start.

Lockman has also excelled against ranked opponents. Lockman tossed a four-hitter but was on the losing end of a 1-0 decision to eighth-ranked Cal on Feb. 24. Her next start came at No. 1 Oklahoma, when she snapped the Sooners' 17-game season-opening win streak with a seven-hit shutout. She is one of only four pitchers to defeat OU this season, and one of two pitchers to shut out the powerful Sooner lineup. Lockman defeated No. 2 Oregon on Sunday, allowing two runs in a complete-game effort in her postseason debut.

Both pitchers earned first-team NFCA All-Midwest region honors for their efforts. Lockman was one of only two freshmen pitchers to earn that recognition.

REVELLE BECOMES NEBRASKA'S ALL-TIME COACHING WINS LEADER

Nebraska's 10-5 victory at Oklahoma State in the second game of a March 3 doubleheader made Rhonda Revelle Nebraska's all-time wins leader across all sports. The victory was Revelle's 768th at Nebraska, as she passed former baseball coach John Sanders, who won 767 games from 1978 to 1997. Revelle then became the 23rd active Division I coach to reach 800 career victories at Penn State on May 4. She owns 799 wins at Nebraska.

HUSKERS GETTING DEFENSIVE

Nebraska's defense has been much improved this season, after struggling in 2012. The Huskers lead the nation in double plays turned (48) and own the Big Ten's second-best fielding percentage (.970), the lowest opponent stolen-base percentage (63 percent) and NU has allowed the fewest stolen bases (29).

Last year, Nebraska finished with a .954 fielding percentage, committing 67 errors in 55 games. The fielding percentage was the lowest by a Husker team since 1994, while the 67 errors were the most by an NU squad since 2004. Through 59 games this season, NU has turned 32 more double plays (48-to-16) than it did last year, while committing eight fewer errors this season and a .016 improvement in fielding percentage in four additional games this spring.

HUSKER PITCHING ALSO IMPROVED FROM 2012

Nebraska's pitching staff has shown great improvement from last year. The Huskers' staff ERA has been well over one full run lower after every game this season than it was last year. NU has owned a season ERA below 2.00 following 57 of its 59 games this season, including twice where the Huskers' season ERA was below 1.00. Last year, the lowest Nebraska's season ERA stood after any one game was 2.79. The Huskers have also allowed one run or less in 29 of their 59 games this year, after allowing one run or fewer just 16 times in last season's 55-game schedule.

Nebraska owns 12 more wins in 59 games this spring than it did in last year's 55-game schedule, while boasting a 1.07 lower ERA. The Huskers have also posted five more shutouts this year than last year. NU has also allowed 53 fewer runs than this year than it did in four additional games.

Individually, Edwards is 30-9 this season with a 1.81 ERA and 10 shutouts in 240.0 innings. Last season, Edwards was 9-5 with a 2.88 ERA and three shutouts in 80.1 innings.

TAYLOR EDWARDS SETS SCHOOL RECORDS

Junior Taylor Edwards put together one of the most impressive individual performances in school history during a 13-4, five-inning victory over Illinois-Chicago on Feb. 9. Edwards had two grand slams and eight RBIs in the win, with both of her grand slams coming with two outs and on a 1-2 pitch. Her eight RBIs were a new school record, and her two grand slams were a first in school history and also tied school records for most grand slams in a season. Edwards is just the fourth player in NCAA history to hit two grand slams in the same game and the first since Holly Krzan of UAB did it against Nicholls State on Feb. 17, 2007.

THOMASON SETS GRAND SLAM RECORD

Senior Brooke Thomason hit her fourth career grand slam in game one of last week's NCAA Super Regional against Oregon. The slam was her second of the season, after she hit a grand slam at Utah State on March 16. Thomason's four grand slams are believed to be a school record. All four of her bases-loaded blasts have come since March of 2012.

Her first career grand slam was a dramatic shot that capped a two-homer game for the native of Overland Park, Kan. In Nebraska's first-ever Big Ten Conference game, Thomason belted a walk-off grand slam with two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning against Northwestern on March 23, 2012, to lift Nebraska to a 9-6 come-from-behind victory. Two weeks later, Thomason hit her second career grand slam, another walk-off shot that wrapped up an 11-0, six-inning victory over Illinois on April 6.

Thomason has hit two of Nebraska's six grand slams this season, believed to be a school record. Junior Taylor Edwards tied an NCAA record with two grand slams in one game against Illinois-Chicago on Feb. 9. Tatum Edwards hit NU's fourth grand slam this season against Minnesota on April 16, and senior Courtney Breault belted a grand slam against Creighton on April 24.

THOMASON HAS BEEN MISS CONSISTENT

Senior Brooke Thomason has been a consistent performer through her first three full seasons, batting better than .300 each year while producing at least seven home runs and 30 RBIs every year. This spring, Thomason has already produced more than 30 RBIs for the fourth straight season, as she is batting .335 with nine home runs and a career-high 56 RBIs. Her consistency has been nearly unmatched in school history.

- ▶ Thomason is the only player in school history to produce four 30-RBI seasons. She was the first Husker ever to open her career with three straight 30-RBI seasons, before eclipsing the mark again this spring. The consistent production has helped Thomason rank second in school history with 175 career RBIs.
- ▶ Thomason is the only player in school history to hit seven home runs all four years of her career. Thomason's consistency has helped her rank in a tie for third in school history with 35 career home runs.
- ▶ With a .335 batting average this spring, Thomason is bidding to become the sixth player in school history to bat at least .300 all four seasons of her career. The five players to accomplish that feat (Denise Day, Tobin Echo-Hawk, Jennifer Lizama, Kim Ogee and Ali Viola) each earned All-America honors in their careers and four were multi-time All-Americans, as the group combined for 11 total All-America awards. Thomason ranks 13th in school history with a .326 career average.
- ▶ Thomason's consistency has helped her join a pair of exclusive Nebraska clubs this season. She was only the fourth Husker to produce 30 career doubles and 30 career home runs, before Taylor Edwards became the fifth on April 16.

HUSKERS ADDING MEMBERS TO 100-100-100 CLUB THIS SEASON

Senior Brooke Thomason and junior Taylor Edwards have joined an elite group in Husker history this season, becoming only the ninth and 10th players, respectively, to produce 100 career hits, RBIs and runs scored. This year marks only the second time in school history (also 2003) that a Husker team has featured two players in the club. Taylor Edwards reached each milestone as a junior, joining Crystal Carwile and Ali Viola as the only Huskers to reach each milestone prior to their senior season.

HUSKER HITTERS LEAVING MARK IN NU RECORD BOOK

Senior Brooke Thomason and junior twins Tatum and Taylor Edwards have left their marks on the Husker record books in their careers. Thomason owns a .326 career batting average with 43 doubles, 35 home runs, 175 RBIs and a .553 slugging percentage. She enters this week second on Nebraska's all-time RBI chart, third in extra-base hits (78) and home runs, fourth in doubles, fifth in total bases (360), sixth in walks (95) and seventh in slugging percentage and 13th in batting average.

Taylor Edwards, the only All-America catcher in school history, enters this weekend with the third-most home runs (35) and hit-by-pitches (24) in Husker history, the fourth-best slugging percentage (.607) and fourth-most RBIs (157) and walks (109), the sixth-most extra-base hits (68) and the 15th-best batting average (.317). Using averages from her first two years, Edwards is on pace to finish her career with a school-record total in walks, the second-most RBIs and third-most home runs.

Tatum Edwards ranks fifth on Nebraska's all-time charts in home runs (32) and sixth in slugging percentage (.572). Tatum could crack the Huskers' all-time top 10 in RBIs before the end of her junior season, needing 13 more RBIs.

WINNING TIME

Nebraska has won 11 games in its final at bat this season, including four times in an eight-game stretch from March 9 to March 22. Four of the 11 wins have come with the Huskers trailing in the seventh or eighth inning, two more came with Nebraska trailing in the bottom of the sixth inning and the other five wins occurred in games where the score was tied in NU's final at bat. Three of the wins have been walk-off victories and four have been extra-inning wins.

The Huskers' first win in the final at bat came in the fourth game of the season on Feb. 10. Nebraska trailed Illinois-Chicago 3-2 in the bottom of the eighth inning, before scoring twice in its final at bat, highlighted by sophomore Jordan Bettiol's walk-off, RBI double.

The Huskers would not need another late-inning victory until nearly a month later. At Wichita State on March 9, the game was tied 1-1 with two outs in the top of the seventh inning before the Huskers scored twice, highlighted by freshman Kiki Stokes' go-ahead, two-out, inside-the-park home run. That began the stretch of four final-at bat victories in eight games for the Huskers.

Six days after the win at Wichita State, Stokes delivered again, belting a walk-off three-run homer in the bottom of the 10th inning that gave Nebraska a 4-1 win over New Mexico State. Four days later against UNO, sophomore Mattie Fowler delivered a walk-off, two-run single with two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning to lift Nebraska to a 3-2 come-from-behind victory. Three days after that win, junior Taylor Edwards was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded to bring home the winning run with two outs in the bottom of the eighth inning of a 5-4 win over Northwestern.

The next weekend at Illinois, the Huskers rallied from a 2-1 seventh-inning deficit to post a 6-2 victory. Senior Courtney Breault tied the game with a clutch pinch-hit, RBI single and Stokes' bases-loaded walk gave Nebraska a 3-2 lead. Taylor Edwards then secured the victory with a three-run double. The following weekend at Iowa, the Huskers and Hawkeyes were tied at 2-2 in the top of the seventh, when a two-out rally resulted in Nebraska scoring the winning run on an error.

Nebraska posted two victories in its final at bat in the next-to-last week of April. Tatum Edwards hit a grand slam with two outs in the bottom of the sixth inning of a 0-0 game with Minnesota on April 16, lifting NU to its eighth win of the year in its final at bat. She then tied Nebraska's next game at Purdue on April 20 with a seventh-inning home run, before senior Courtney Breault delivered a victory with a three-run homer in the ninth inning.

The Huskers' 10th win in their final at bat came on April 28 against No. 9 Michigan. Nebraska trailed 4-2 in the bottom of the sixth inning before freshman Hailey Decker hit a go-ahead three-run homer and senior Brooke Thomason added a two-run double, as Nebraska rallied for a 7-4 win.

Against Purdue in the Big Ten Tournament on May 10, the Huskers trailed 2-1 in the bottom of the sixth inning before a game-tying RBI single from Decker and a two-out, game-winning RBI single from Fowler.

HUSKERS HOMERING AT NEAR-RECORD RATE

Nebraska reached both the 25- and 30-home run plateaus faster than any other team in school history this season. This year's group hit 25 home runs in 21 games, eclipsing the previous mark set by the 1998 team, who hit its 25th home run in its 26th game. NU produced its 30th homer in its 26th game this year, better the previous mark of 29 games set in 2002 and 2011. Nebraska slugged its 50th home run in its 48th game this year, becoming only the fourth team in school history to hit 50 home runs. The Huskers tied the 2011 squad as the second-fastest teams to reach the mark, behind the 1998 squad (44 games).

Ten Huskers have homered already this season - tying the school record - with junior twins Taylor (12 homers) and Tatum (11) Edwards leading the way. The duo has combined for 23 home runs this year, after totaling 12 combined homers in 2012. Nebraska currently ranks third in school history with 56 home runs and is four home runs from second place on that list and six shy of tying the school record.

The long ball production is fueled by a lineup that features three players with 30 career home runs for the first time in school history. Thomason and the Edwards twins all rank among the top five home-run hitters in school history (Tay. Edwards - t-3rd; Thomason - t-3rd; Tat. Edwards - t-5th).

FOWLER A CLUTCH CO-CAPTAIN

Sophomore Mattie Fowler has been a clutch hitter through her first two seasons as a Husker. Fowler, a co-captain, has especially come through in the clutch in late innings. She owns 10 game-winning RBIs in her career, including three in the seventh inning or later. Fowler has also added a clutch game-tying, two-run homer in the sixth inning against Northwestern on March 22, and a game-winning sixth-inning RBI single against Purdue on May 10.

Nebraska has played six extra-inning games in Fowler's career, winning all six games. In 2012, NU won three games in the eighth inning. Fowler drove in the game-winning run in two of those victories and scored the game-winning run in the third. This season, Fowler has scored the game-winning run in one of the Huskers' three extra-inning victories, while also producing a game-winning, walk-off, two-run single in the bottom of the seventh inning against UNO. She also added a clutch game-tying, two-run homer in the sixth inning against Northwestern on March 22. Against Purdue on May 10, Fowler won the game with a two-out, RBI single in the sixth inning.

TATUM EDWARDS HITS WELL WHEN PITCHING

Tatum Edwards has proven to be a dangerous hitter, as her ability with the bat has been the primary reason she has earned all-conference honors in each of her first two seasons and it played a role in her being a first-team All-Big Ten and All-Midwest Region selection this spring. With Edwards focusing enough on pitching to be named the Big Ten Pitcher of the year, one might wonder if her offensive numbers may suffer as she pitches more innings. But that hasn't been the case for the junior thus far in her career. In fact, Edwards has put up better numbers when she's pitching than when she's the designated player or starts in the field.

Below is a look at Edwards' career batting statistics when she is also the starting pitcher, as well as a comparison of Edwards' statistics when she pitches and when she does not.

HUSKERS PRODUCED SECOND-HIGHEST CONFERENCE RUN TOTAL VS. NORTHWESTERN

Nebraska scored 14 runs in game two of a doubleheader with Northwestern on March 22 in a 14-1, five-inning victory. The 14 runs marked the second-highest run total the Huskers have ever scored in a conference game. It was one shy of matching the school record set on April 6, 1996 in a 15-11 Big 12 Conference victory over Kansas. The 14 runs scored against Northwestern were the most runs Nebraska has ever scored in a conference game of fewer than seven innings. The Huskers have also put up double-digit run totals in Big Ten play at Iowa (11 runs), against Wisconsin (11 runs) and at Purdue (12 runs).

LOCKMAN TOSSES FIRST CAREER NO-HITTER

Freshman right-hander Emily Lockman joined an elite group of Husker pitchers by tossing her first career no-hitter, a six-inning effort against Utah State on Feb. 16. Lockman was the first Husker freshman to throw a no-hitter since Summer Tobias in 2003 and just the fifth ever.

Lockman's no-hitter came in only her fourth career start and was the earliest no-hitter in school history. A native of Corona, Calif., Lockman is just the second Husker to throw a no-hitter in the month of February, joining All-American Peaches James who recorded her second career no-hitter as a senior on Feb. 20, 2004 against Houston. Lockman recorded her first career no-hitter faster than any other pitcher in school history, needing only her fourth start, bettering the previous record of seven starts by Tobias.

HUSKERS KNOCK OFF NO. 1 FOR SECOND TIME IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Behind a seven-hit shutout from Emily Lockman and a solo home run from Tatum Edwards, Nebraska upset top-ranked Oklahoma, 1-0, in Norman on March 2. The win was Nebraska's second victory over a top-ranked opponent in school history, joining a 1-0 upset of No. 1 Florida on March 12, 2011. The win over the Gators came at a neutral site in Clearwater, Fla., as the win over Oklahoma marked the highest ranked opponent the Huskers have ever defeated on the road. The win also snapped the Sooners' 17-game season-opening win streak.

TATUM EDWARDS WINS FINAL TWO BIG TEN PITCHER-OF-THE-WEEK AWARDS

Junior right-hander Tatum Edwards won the final two Big Ten Pitcher-of-the-Week awards for the 2013 season. She has won a total of four Big Ten Pitcher-of-the-Week honors in her career, also earning two awards last season.

In the next-to-last weekend of the regular season, Edwards was honored for winning two games against No. 9 Michigan. Edwards fired a two-hitter in a 6-1 victory in the series opener, holding the Wolverines to a season-low two hits and season-low one run. Her complete-game victory snapped Michigan's nation-leading 22-game win streak and also halted the Wolverines' 21-game winning streak in conference play. Edwards' second win came after tossing 3.0 scoreless innings of no-hit relief. Her efforts helped NU win a conference series from a top-10 opponent for the first time since 2001.

In the final week of the regular season at Penn State, Edwards went 2-0 with a 0.50 ERA. She tossed a three-hitter and allowed only one run in the series opener, then fired a one-hit shutout in the series finale. Edwards allowed only four hits in 14.0 innings, holding opponents to an .098 average.

TYSON NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Dawna Tyson was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on March 11. Tyson was honored for her outstanding performance in game two at Wichita State on March 9. Tyson reached base in all three of her plate appearances, finishing 2-for-2 with a hit-by-pitch. She homered for her third consecutive game and produced three RBIs.

LOCKMAN TWO-TIME BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Emily Lockman earned her second Big Ten Freshman-of-the-Week honor on March 4. She was honored for the first time on Feb. 18. Lockman's first award came after she posted a 2-0 record with a pair of shutouts, 15 strikeouts and a 0.41 ERA at the Hillenbrand Invitational in Tucson, Ariz. Included in that performance was a six-inning no-hitter against Utah State that was the first no-hitter by a Husker freshman since 2003 and just the fourth overall. She added a career-high eight strikeouts against the Aggies.

Two weeks later, Lockman again posted a 2-0 record with road wins at Oklahoma and Oklahoma State. She threw a seven-hit shutout against the top-ranked Sooners, handing OU its first loss of the year.

TAYLOR EDWARDS NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior catcher Taylor Edwards was named the first Big Ten Player of the Week for the 2013 season on Feb. 11. Edwards went 10-for-18 on the weekend, posting a .556 batting average to go along with a .636 on-base percentage and 1.167 slugging percentage. She also homered three times, doubled twice and drove in 15 runs.

Against Illinois-Chicago, Edwards hit a pair of grand slams to become the first Husker to hit two grand slams in one game. She finished with eight RBIs in Nebraska's 13-4 victory, setting a school record for most RBIs in a game. Edwards enjoyed another big game in the tournament finale against New Mexico, finishing 3-for-3 with a double, a home run and five RBIs.

HUSKERS TIED BEST 10-GAME START IN SCHOOL HISTORY

With a 9-1 record through its first 10 games, Nebraska matched the best 10-game start in school history. This season marked the fourth time in Husker history that a team has won nine of its first 10 games, a feat that also happened in 1996, 2003, 2006 and 2011. Nebraska also posted 11 victories in the month of February, tying for the third-most February wins in school history. The Huskers' lone loss among its first 10 games and all four February losses overall came against top-20 opponents.

NEBRASKA WAS SUCCESSFUL IN SEASON'S OPENING MONTH

Nebraska finished 11-4 in February, allowing the Huskers to go from unranked and not receiving any votes to a No. 25 national ranking in the first USA Softball/ESPN.com poll in the month of March. The Huskers' 11 victories tied for the third-most in the month of February in school history.

Only the 2011 (14) and 2003 (12) Huskers won more games in February than this year's team. The 2002 squad also won 11 games in February. Each of those three teams went on to successful seasons and ended the year in the top 25. The 2011 Huskers notched the first victory over a No. 1 team in school history, the 2003 squad climbed to the highest ranking in school history (No. 3) and the 2002 Huskers were the last NU team to play in the WCWS.

PITCHING STAFF POSTED FANTASTIC FEBRUARY

Nebraska's pitching was tremendous in the season's opening month, especially considering the Huskers' three pitchers had combined for only 130.0 career innings entering this season.

The Huskers allowed one earned run or less in 11 of 15 games in February, including five shutouts, while posting a 1.44 ERA. During a stretch that began with Illinois-Chicago on Feb. 10 and ended with Purdue on Feb. 17, NU threw three shutouts and one no-hitter, while tossing 38.1 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run.

The pitching staff also fared well against some of the nation's best teams in February. Junior Tatum Edwards allowed just two earned runs in a pair of complete-game efforts against No. 19 Arizona and No. 1 Oklahoma, taking a no-hitter into the seventh inning against the Sooners. She also threw a shutout against No. 24 Florida State. Emily Lockman started against No. 8 California, firing a four-hitter and holding Cal to a season-low one run.

Nebraska finished February with a 1.44 ERA, just missing posting Nebraska's lowest ERA in the month since 2000. Since 2000, the lowest ERA a Husker team has ever posted after the opening month of the season was 1.43 in 2003, when Nebraska went 12-1 in February and climbed to as high as No. 3 in the national polls.

NEBRASKA'S GOLDEN GIRLS

Nebraska has enjoyed both recent and historical success recruiting talented players from California. The 2013 Husker roster features six natives of the Golden State. Included in that group are three players who earned California player-of-the-year honors during their high school careers. Junior Tatum Edwards was named the state's freshman of the year in 2007, while her twin sister Taylor was the California Junior of the Year in 2009, in addition to earning accolades as the nation's top junior from EA Sports. The third member of the Golden State player-of-the-year trio is freshman Emily Lockman, who was the California Gatorade Player of the Year in 2012.

Senior Courtney Breault, a 2012 and 2013 second-team All-Big Ten selection, and freshmen Danica Bishop and Dawna Tyson round out the California natives on NU's 2013 roster.

FOWLER AND THOMASON SELECTED AS HUSKER CO-CAPTAINS

Sophomore Mattie Fowler and senior Brooke Thomason serve as Nebraska's co-captains for the 2013 season. Thomason is a four-year starter in right field who was a second-team All-Big 12 selection in 2010 and a second-team All-Big Ten pick in 2012 and 2013. Fowler is one of the lead organizers for team functions. She was Nebraska's starting shortstop as a freshman in 2012, and is the Huskers' starting first baseman this spring.

PROGRAM STABILITY

Nebraska softball is renowned for its tradition and one of the Huskers' richest traditions is stability. Nowhere is this highlighted more than looking at NU Head Coach Rhonda Revelle and Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel.

Revelle is in her 21st season at the helm of the Husker program in 2013, while Sippel is in her 24th year in Lincoln. Both coaches also played for Nebraska, with Revelle enjoying a three-year career and Sippel starring for four years. Counting their playing and coaching days, Revelle and Sippel have combined to be a part of 1,108 of Nebraska's 1,275 all-time victories (87 percent).

HUSKERS AT THE HEAD OF THE CLASS

Nebraska leads all softball programs nationally with 29 CoSIDA Academic All-America awards won by 21 players. The total also ranks second nationally among all female athletic programs, trailing only the Husker volleyball team's 37 selections. Overall, NU leads all institutions nationally with 302 academic All-Americans across all sports.

NU is one of only three softball programs with 20 or more selections. Since Rhonda Revelle became Nebraska's head coach in 1993, she has produced 13 academic All-Americans, the highest total of any coach during that span.

NEBRASKA 10TH-FASTEST PROGRAM TO POST 1,000 NCAA VICTORIES

Since softball became an official NCAA sport in 1982, Nebraska has posted 1,140 victories, winning its 1,000th game at Women's College World Series qualifier Missouri on May 2, 2009. Although no official statistic is kept for victories in the NCAA era, according to research from CBS College Sports, the Huskers were the 10th program to win 1,000 games as an NCAA sport. The nine other teams that reached 1,000 NCAA wins before Nebraska were UCLA, Arizona, Florida State, Cal State Fullerton, Louisiana-Lafayette, California, Texas A&M, Oklahoma and East Carolina.

NEBRASKA'S NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

Nebraska is in an elite class when it comes to postseason play, as NU's rich history dates back to the inaugural Women's College World Series in Omaha in 1982. In the NCAA Tournament, the Huskers have:

- ▶ Made 21 all-time appearances, a total that ranks 10th in NCAA Division I history.
- ▶ Won 55 games, a total that ranks 13th in NCAA Division I history.
- ▶ Posted a .561 winning percentage, a total that ranks 20th in NCAA Division I history.
- ▶ Advanced to the WCWS seven times, a total that ranks 10th in NCAA Division I history.
- ▶ Compiled a 55-43 (.561) all-time NCAA Tournament record.
- ▶ Compiled an 8-12 (.400) all-time Women's College World Series record.
- ▶ Hosted nine NCAA Regionals, winning the regional championship six times.
- ▶ Compiled an 11-20 (.355) record against teams from the Pac-12 (4-1 in 2013) and an 0-1 mark vs. Washington.
